Sunday, January 2, 2022 The Epiphany of the Lord

Isaiah 60:1-6 Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 Matthew 2:1-12

Today, the church celebrates the Epiphany of the Lord. The Catholic Church considers the visit from the Magi, who were foreign astronomers or philosophers to be an important time because of the revelation of Jesus' presence in the world to people who were not members of the Israelite nation. This is very significant because it takes the incarnation of God on earth to the whole world and makes salvation available to anyone who recognizes the holiness of the Lord.

The readings are charged with emotion as we hear from Isaiah that the darkness of sin and guilt are to be overcome by the light that comes from God's presence on the earth in the form of a little child. We also hear that the Magi are bringing Frankincense and Myrrh as gifts to the child. It is significant that these are spices and oils used in the burial process. Thus, the cross is not far from Jesus, even in his nativity. In Paul's letter to the Ephesians he makes the connection between the salvation of the Jews and that of gentiles, calling us coheirs and copartners in the promise of Christ Jesus. In this way the salvation of the Jews becomes the salvation of the whole world through the generosity of God. In the gospel we see the role that Herod plays as the embodiment of evil and someone who would try to hold back the grace of God that the world so desperately seeks.

Let us take courage from the presence of God in our world and in our lives. As we end the Christmas season and begin a new calendar year, we are able to join the rest of the world in hope and anticipation of the Lord's gracious plan for our salvation. Let us turn toward the light of Christ and dispel the darkness of doubt.


