Spiritual Reflection for Sunday January 24, 2021

Jonah 3: 1-5, 10

PS 25

I Corinthians 7: 29-31

Mark 1: 14-20

The second reading today, from 1 Corinthians, tells us that time is running out. Paul is reminding the people of Corinth that although they may think that they have an unlimited amount of time to amend their lives, that in fact their time is limited. Paul tells them to totally change their ways, to reverse their



actions in order that they be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

We too need to hear Paul's message. Actually, we need to hear the message repeatedly because it is a message that is easily ignored by most people. As individuals we often think that there is more time to accomplish almost any task, and that any deadline can be forgiven or pushed back to accommodate us. Of course, in daily life, this might be true, but in God's time, that it is not the case. In fact, Paul states, "...the world in its present form is passing away."

If we truly take to heart what Paul says to the Corinthians and to us as well, then we must begin to change today. The first step in change is to come to grips with who we really are. We must account for what our life has been to this point. We must admit to what direction we are currently heading before we can change course. As we move ever closer to the season of Lent, let us look at our lives and prepare ourselves for the work that lies ahead that we might be made worthy of the promises of Christ.






Pray the Rosary Daily
