Many are invited; few are chosen! These are the final words of the Gospel we hear this weekend. I am not sure about you, but these words give me a chill every time I hear them. Does it make you wonder why God would invite you and not choose you? Every time I hear this Gospel, I begin to think of a partic-



ular word that I often reflect on. That word is "worthy." Are we worthy to be in the presence of God: worthy of His love; worthy to receive Him in the Eucharist? These questions come up in my mind as well as people ask me them often. If we reflect on being worthy, we can ask ourselves: are we doing our best to be worthy disciples of Christ? The better question to ask ourselves this week is: are we ready to receive his presence, His love, and His very being in the Eucharist? Many times, we get so caught up in wondering if we are worthy or not, when we must remember that He gives us all those things freely. Let's take a look this week at our readings. In the book of Isaiah, we hear that the Lord of hosts will provide for all people, while St Paul's letter to the Philippians reminds us that God will supply whatever you need... you have been called to the banquet of the Lord knowing that He will provide for you even in what you lack. None of us are complete. We come to the Lord with all our baggage and difficulties and lay them at His feet. We recognize that none of us are completely worthy, but He gives of Himself freely each time we come to Him in prayer and adoration. Take some time this week and reflect on how you can become closer to God and accept His presence in your lives this week.

HOPE Appeal 2020

Last weekend we began our 2020 drive. You should have received a letter from Bishop Lucia asking for your support.

Father Kurgan is asking all parishioners to contribute to this year's HOPE Appeal. In an effort to meet our goal, I am asking every family in the parish to consider a minimum gift of



\$325.00 (less than \$0.90 a day or less than \$27 a month). If you are able to contribute more, I prayerfully encourage you to do so. If you are not able to make the minimum gift, please give something. Your gift, no matter the size, whether it is a pledge or a one-time gift, is important.

If we all give, we will easily meet Holy Cross' 2020 HOPE Appeal goal of \$101,362.59, which is our parish share of the support for HOPE Appeal-funded ministries, programs, and services. If we exceed our 2020 HOPE Appeal goal, 100 percent of the excess will be returned directly to our parish. Normally, we keep 50% of the excess but this year the Diocese wants each parish to keep any amount collected in excess of the goal. We plan to use these funds to continue the mission of Holy Cross Parish.

Thank you to everyone who has already returned their HOPE Appeal pledge card! If you haven't made your decision about your gift, please prayerfully consider your HOPE pledge and review the HOPE Appeal brochure that was included in the Bishop's mailing. Please bring your completed pledge card to Mass next weekend and drop it in the box along with your weekly contribution. Your may also drop it by the office or mail it to the parish office. If you would rather pledge your gift you may do so at syrdio.org.

Together, when we pledge our gift to the Annual HOPE Appeal, we are giving thanks to Christ for the innumerable gifts we've been given and helping our friends and neighbors who benefit each year from the diocesan good works funded through our annual appeal.



Spiritual Adoption Program Month Two - Developing Baby

"I can suck my thumb now!" The developing baby is now called a "Fetus" (Latin for "little one"). The child is making rapid progress developing all external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. The ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen.



Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all baby systems are present. This little one can now suck its thumb and is about two inches long. Thank you for praying for this precious little baby!
