<u>Spiritual Reflection for Sunday October 18, 2020</u> <u>The Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u>

Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6 1 Thessalonians 1: 1-5b Matthew 22: 15-21

Today the Gospel of Matthew reminds us that our primary allegiance is not to any particular nation or group in as much as we belong to God first. God is the creator of all. Many people do not want to be possessed by anyone, let alone God. They want the right to choose to which group to belong. We often forget that God creates us in His image and that He has written His law on our hearts.

In the Gospel, the Pharisees try to entrap Jesus by asking Him if it is legal to pay the census tax to Caesar. Of course, Jesus recognizes their insincerity and asked them whose face is imprinted on their coins. They answer Caesar and Jesus responds "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

God has imprinted himself on our hearts and in our souls as He has created us in His image. Do we repay to God what we possess because it is truthfully God's or do we claim our possessions as fruits of our own labor and refuse to give back to God from our good fortune?

"I can suck my thumb now!" The developing baby is now called a "Fetus" (Latin for "little one"). The child is making rapid progress developing all external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. The ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be

recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all baby systems are present. This little one can now suck its thumb and is about two inches long. Thank you for praying for this precious little baby!
