

The Rubrics (Liturgical directions) of the new Roman Missal offers a number of places during Mass for the Choir or Schola to sing a musical offering, motet, or anthem. Also, if there is a solo, whether vocal or instrumental, the same applies. The primary spots for these musical offerings are at the end of Communion time or right afterward, so that the assembly can meditate on the text and be uplifted by the music. A few brief moments of silence afterward before the final prayers allow time for quiet prayer. During the Offertory (bringing up of the gifts) is also recommended, if this time is not too brief. The Choir sometimes sings before Mass, for the Prelude, and if there is a special festive anthem, this occurs as a Recessional / Postlude. The music echoes Scripture or a paraphrase of the Readings or Liturgical season Ernest Camerota


