Reflection for the Weekend of October 23-24

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9 Psalm: 126:1-2,2-3,4-5,6

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

It's interesting for us to reflect on the fact that Bartimaeus—a man impeded by his lack of sight—is able to recognize who Jesus *really* is (Lord and Messiah)! Bartimaeus knows from what he has heard that Jesus has the power to heal and save. Even though he was repeatedly dismissed and told to be quiet, because of his ability to "see" Jesus for who he is, Bartimaeus refused to miss his chance for an encounter with him. Yet here, through no physical touch of the Lord, no concoction of spit and mud, but rather Jesus says "your faith has saved you." A word from the mouth of Jesus, together with the faith instilled and nourished in the heart of Bartimaeus—healing, sight, and restoration of life are now his.

Juxtapose this now with our first reading...was it really Bartimaeus' initiative to seek out Jesus? Or had Jesus been calling him from within his heart the whole time leading up to that salvific moment? When the crowd finally tells Bartimaeus that Jesus is calling him, wasn't that something that had been true long before that day? In our first reading from Jeremiah, we have beautiful imagery for God's attentive—and constant—fatherhood toward us even after we have straved or been unconscious of his presence:

> The Lord has delivered his people...Behold I will bring them back...gathered from the ends of the world...they departed in tears, but I will console and guide them ... I will lead them to brooks of water, on level road, so that none shall stumble. For I am a father to Israel. (cf. Jer 31: 7-9)

Are we actively responding to the generosity of God leading us gently to the place where he will ultimately heal us and reclaim us as his own? Are we still waiting for that encounter? Today may we recognize God's intentional activity alive within us, and like Bartimaeus, may we immediately get up and follow after Jesus upon receiving this "sight."



Please join us to mark the feast day of such a great saint of our Church.
