

The afternoon of **Sunday, October 27th** will be the Confirmation Mass for Holy Cross' 2019 class. We are grateful to have Bishop Emeritus Cunningham confer this sacrament on them and are so proud of the young people receiving this sacrament. Veni Sancte Spiritus!

Quick teaching moment -Confirmation

Over the past few decades we have often heard that Confirmation is a "confirming a decision to be Catholic", a "choosing the faith" or "becoming an adult in the faith". Although this is partially true (in America, is it is a completion of the sacraments of initiation), it can be misleading especially when different parts of Catholicism confer this sacrament much earlier in life. Many US Diocese are returning Confirmation to its original place before 1st Communion (2nd grade), whereas in the eastern Catholic Church, Confirmation has always been done immediately after baptism (infancy). When Confirmation is treated as a teen's "graduation" or a "catholic bar-mitzvah", it communicates that they have now completed something and are now finished. When if fact, the young people's faith is being strengthened, not their work completed! Also, we've missed what God is actually doing in them. The truth is far more beautiful (and useful) for our young people. Confirmation, coming from the Latin word confirmare, actually means strengthening. Our young people are already Catholic. They are a member of the Church by baptism, and since our faith is relational, our young people already have a daily choice of choosing to follow Jesus. Confirmation is giving them more of the Holy Spirit to strengthen and aid in their relationship with Jesus that already exists. October 27th is a huge day in our young people's lives, not because they are "choosing to be Catholic" but because the 3rd Person of the Trinity is going to descend from Heaven to fill and strengthen them in a way unlike any other moment in their life!

LIFE MATTERS

Proponents of abortion justify its violation of the moral law and constitutional law by arguing that the baby is not a human person. This issue may come again before the Supreme Court. Philosophy Prof. Peter Kreeft (Boston U.) gives us a clear explanation of why "personhood" begins at conception: The gist of his reasoning is that the essence of a person is



NOT defined by its "function" or stage of development but by its being. Functionalism is the "root pro-choice error" and applies not only during gestation, but also to persons with infirmities and the aged. Dr. Kreeft says, "Abortion is a clear-cut evil.
