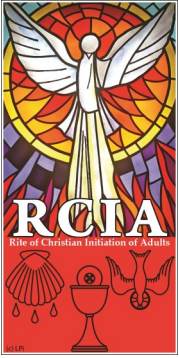

Have people mentioned to you that they wish they had your faith?

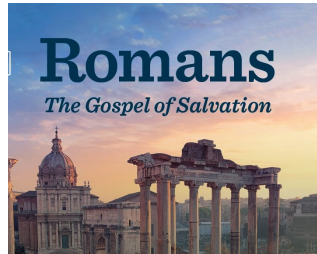

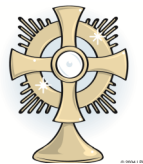

Newly proposed changes to the Health Care Proxy Law (Art. 29-c, PHL) are now before the Legislature in New York (A-730) and (S-5939). These bills **remove protections** for families of **incapacitated** patients and transfer the decisions on health care, including nutrition and hydration, to **third parties** regardless of the patient's or family wishes. This negatively affects the ability of patients to receive appropriate care, especially near the end of life.
