

### **Reflection for Christ The King Sunday**

### Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17 Psalm 23 1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28 Matthew 25:31-46

As we celebrate Christ the King Sunday, we are now shifting from the ordinary season to the season of Advent. A time of preparation for Christ to come and dwell in our hearts. On this last week of Ordinary Time, we recall Christ as our king and ruler. Our first reading from the Prophet Ezekiel speaks of God tending to his sheep. This image of God as shepherd is a beautiful image to reflect upon. Often



when we think of a shepherd, we think of one who cares for his animals and leads them from any harm. That is the same image we focus on today. As Ezekiel states, God will lead His people from darkness, give them rest, seek them out, heal them, and shepherd them rightly. The final verse of the first reading reminds us that God will separate and judge one sheep from another, the rams and the goats. When the time comes for the final judgment Christ will be the judge. This is not to be viewed as a "fire and brimstone judgment" but simply meant to remind us of Christ's kingship. We see this imagery of shepherding in our psalm as well from Psalm 23:" the Lord is my shepherd, there is noting I shall want." How has God been leading you over this last year? I think we can all agree this year has been anything but average, with Covid-19 the absence of being able to be with people as we normally would. God leads us in all that we do, and where we go. How can you see His presence in your life leading you? God leads us gently as a shepherd. Take some time and let Him lead you if you have not already done that. Remember His presence is always among us each day of our lives. Fr Matt Rawson

### <u>Spiritual Adoption Program</u> Month Three - Developing Baby

"I grabbed my hand!" The baby can now squint, swallow & move its tongue. The baby sleeps & awakens. Fingernails & toenails form & it now has its own unique set of fingerprints. Sensitive to touch, it will tightly grasp an object placed in the palm of its hand. The baby breathes amniotic fluid to help develop &



strengthen the respiratory system, but gets the oxygen needed through the umbilical cord. The baby you are praying for weighs one ounce & is about 3 inches in length.

### **Other Suggestions:**

**Intercession:** May each expectant mother making an adoption plan receive support and care of the Christian community as she makes a loving choice for her child.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

**Reflection:** To a woman facing an unexpected pregnancy in difficult circumstances, adoption is sometimes felt to be worse than aborting her child. In reality, placing a child for adoption is a loving, generous & sacrificial option that demonstrates a woman's profound, long-term motherly care. In considering & choosing whether to place her child for adoption, a mother seeks what is best for her child, making a selfless act of love. Still, a woman considering adoption may experience a number of conflicting emotions. It is essential that she be supported throughout & after the process, whether she decides to place her child with another loving family or to raise her child herself. By grace, we are made children of God through adoption and can call him.

Acts of Reparation: Offer this Prayer for Pregnant Mothers, praying especially for this month's intention. Take a copy of this beautiful prayer from the Spiritual Adoption Board in the main entrance of church.

Abstain from meat or another enjoyment for one day this week. Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's intention.
