Sunday December 12, 2021 **Third Sunday of Advent**

Zephaniah 3: 14-18a Philippians 4: 4-7 Luke 3: 10-18

Today, the Third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday," a Latin Verb form of "rejoice". Our faith calls us to rejoice in the fact that the earthly birth of our Savior is near! In St.



Paul's letter to the Philippians, he reminds the faithful to "Rejoice in the Lord always." St. Paul is so insistent that the believers show their joy that he repeats himself a second time, imploring them to rejoice! He goes on to remind them that as members of the faithful they should "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God."

On this Gaudete Sunday, we should rejoice in a particularly intense way. Our personal prayer of thanksgiving and petition is a form of rejoicing. We may seldom think of prayer as our rejoicing in our Savior Jesus Christ, but indeed, we do rejoice in the one who calls us to prayer and answers those same prayers in a way that is best for us. Today, as we celebrate together the mid-point of Advent let us give thanks for all the prayers that God has answered for us, and let us remember that the mercies of God are not exhausted!




