We would like to take this time to wish each and every one of you a Blessed Christmas season and a Happy New Year!

As we began the celebration of Advent we also began a new liturgical year. Advent is the time of preparation for the coming of Christ. The Advent wreath has demonstrated that Christ's light continues to increase in our lives. Each year we celebrate Advent and Christmas to remind ourselves that Jesus is always with us, that His light can burn within our heart, our families and our faith communities if we allow Him to be present. That light that we seek culminates with the celebration of the birth of Christ on Christmas day. Indeed, the Christmas daytime prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours offers this pray for our reflection:

Your eternal Word leaped down from heaven
in the silent watches of the night,

Each of us individually and as Church should be filled with wonder that our God loves us so much that He would bless us with His only begotten Son.

As the Christmas season accompanies us into our new year, a new year that is filled with hope for the future, we pray that all of us enter this new year with the hope that the Christ child offers to all people.

# Join us for Mass at Holy Cross
