

Spiritual Reflection for Sunday December 27, 2020

Genesis 15:1-6; 21:1-3 Colossians 3:12-21 Luke 2:22-40

We see today that the parents of Jesus are observant Jews. They take Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. It was written in the law of the Lord that "Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord," and to offer the sacrifice of a pair



of turtledoves or two young pigeons. It should not be lost on us that Jesus will become the offering, replacing animals as the sacrificial offerings.

As Mary and Joseph present the child Jesus, they encounter Simeon, who was a devout man, living in Jerusalem. The Holy Spirit revealed to Simeon that he would not encounter death until he had seen the Christ of the Lord. When Simeon encounters the child Jesus, he takes the child into his arms and proclaims: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

Imagine the amazement that Mary and Joseph experienced when they hear Simeon's proclamation, which we know as the Canticle of Simeon. They have already received mysterious messages delivered to them that foretell the greatness of the child, and yet they still must ponder the message's meaning.

For our reflection today in this Christmas Season, let us experience the Canticle of Simeon in the same way Mary and Joseph experienced it; as new and wonderful. May Simeon cause us to ponder the true greatness of Christ in our life!



<u>Spiritual Adoption Program</u> Month Four - "I had a dream"

Your baby's brain has begun maturing - a process that will continue until they are about 14 years old. The baby's eyelids are now sealed and will re-open at 7 months. Their taste buds are now working. Nutrients consumed by their mother are passed on within an hour or two.



Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to parents of the baby can be seen at this time. This month REMS (rapid eye movements) have been recorded - a sign of dreaming. Your baby is now about 9 inches in length. Thank you for praying!
