Sunday December 6, 2020

Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11 Psalm 85 2 Peter 3:8-14 Mark 1:1-8

Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight His paths. As we journey towards Christmas we are called to a deeper sense of prayer and reflection. During these weeks of Advent, we find ways to be able to prepare our hearts and homes for Christ. As we prepare our homes, what do they look like? Are we prepping them and beginning to unpack



the decorations so that we can celebrate with friends or family? While we prepare our homes, we should be preparing our hearts as well. This means dusting off the bible and maybe opening it to a particular passage we might enjoy reflecting on. One challenge we might take is reading the Gospel of Luke during this Advent season. The Gospel of Luke opens with the infancy narrative and reminds us of what we are preparing ourselves for. As we continue to prepare our hearts this Advent season, we remember that Confession is always a beautiful opportunity to prepare our hearts for Christmas. As we begin this new liturgical year let's start it on a good note. We can frequent the Sacrament of Confession here at Holy Cross on Wednesday evening before Holy Hour and Saturdays before Mass.

When we have made provisions to prepare the way of the Lord in our own hearts now, we are able to allow those preparations to take root. After we have had the opportunity to go to confession, work on our prayer lives, take some time to read scripture, maybe we implement something we can do to help us continue doing these things. It does not take much to form a habit but enough persistence and desire. If we want to walk with Christ this Advent and Christmas season, we must be able to form healthy prayer lives and habits. What can you do to strengthen those habits and continue them through this liturgical year?

Your baby's brain has begun maturing - a process that will continue until they are about 14 years old. The baby's eyelids are now sealed and will re-open at 7 months. Their taste buds are now working. Nutrients consumed by their mother are passed on within an hour or two.



Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to parents of the baby can be seen at this time. This month REMS (rapid eye movements) have been recorded - a sign of dreaming. Your baby is now about 9 inches in length.
