### Spiritual Reflection for Sunday February 14, 2021

Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46 Psalm 32 I Corinthians 10:31-11:1 Mark 1:40-45

Paul invites his readers to "be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." As Paul has experienced his conversion and now has helped form church communities devoted to Christ, he



finds that those who are filled with the faith of Jesus, and want to follow him, are falling back into old ways.

We know that the old ways always seem like the better way. In the case of the followers of Jesus, this is not true. The old way led to death, whereas the way of Jesus leads to new life. Even though the early ones had faith in eternal life they still would revert to what they had known before.

Before we critique their action it is important for us to look at our own lives. If we consider our habitual sin as a "tradition" for us we realize that we are called to move away from that sin and embrace what Christ offers us, and yet we know we are always tempted to look back.

This Lent, let us set our eyes on salvation, do not look back, but only look to Christ, the one who will lead us home.



### Ash Wednesday – February 17th

In keeping with the various health and safety precautions in place for the celebration of the sacraments during the COVID-19 pandemic, the distribution of Ashes will take place in the Diocese of Syracuse this year by way of the Roman custom, which entails sprinkling them on the crown of the head.

Ashes will be distributed on Ash Wednesday, February 17 during all of the Masses (7:45, 10:30 & 5:30) and 12:00 during the Liturgical Service. The Liturgical Service includes Liturgy of the Word, homily & distribution of ashes.

\*LENTEN REGULATIONS - Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are days of fast & abstinence. Catholics 14 years of age & older are bound to abstain from meat on the Fridays during Lent. Catholics age 18 to 59 are bound to the law of fasting. ("The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing-as far as quantity & quality are concerned-approved local custom."


