Rite of Acceptance

Rite of Welcome

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or RCIA (now also known as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, OCIA) is the ancient process through which adults journey together while seeking to be welcomed into full communion with the Catholic Church. RCIA is not a class, nor is it a race to see how much information about the faith individuals can consume over the course of a year or more! Rather, it is primarily about one's relationship with the Lord and how he or she is being invited deeper to share in His body, the Church. Individuals will certainly grow in knowledge of the faith, but also they must grow in prayer so as to deepen their readiness to receive

the invitation to the divine life in the Sacraments that Jesus offers to all of us.

This journey is marked by certain rites along the way both for the individuals and for us, the Church they will soon be welcomed into. The timing of these various rites mark their readiness to take the next step and invite our prayerful support as members of their family. This is truly the mission of the Church alive and at work!

Last Sunday at the 7:30 AM Mass, we celebrated the Rite of Acceptance and Rite of Welcome, a public display of the desire these individuals have to join the Church. It demonstrates a transition from simply an interested inquirer to active Catechumen (not yet baptized) or Candidate (already baptized). As seen in the intentionality of this rite last Sunday, quite literally, a

Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, JANUARY 23, 2022

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10 Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

"You are Christ's body and individually parts of it". These profound words should add meaning to our existence here on this earth. The first Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, which we hear today as our second reading, reminds us that we are integral to the Body of Christ. St. Paul reminds the people of Corinth of this fact because as this new community of believers strives to follow Christ, they lose their way, just as we do.

As we have heard recently, we must value ourselves because God has created us, and not by accident, but for a particular purpose. God knows our purpose, a purpose that is there for us to explore and accept as we journey through our life. We being an important part of the Body of Christ makes us recall that we are the hands and feet of Christ on this earth. We are his ears and his mouth; we feel the pain of others and work with our hearts, minds and hands to make Christ come alive in those who seek him for whatever reason.

Paul enumerates the idea that all the parts of the body are important. He helps us imagine what would happen if our foot or hand, eye or ear, were separated from the rest of the body. Certainly, the body would not be complete, and would not function well.

Let us recall how at times the body of Christ fails to function, as it should. What is missing? Perhaps what is missing is the realization that we all are important to God, and that we all together make up the body of Christ on the earth. Perhaps we are the ones missing.

Adoration

From her earliest teachings, the Catholic Church has understood that Jesus, on the last night of his life, took bread and wine and in a literal way changed it into his actual Body and Blood. The early Church developed a special time of prayer with the Eucharist taking a piece of consecrated host, the Eucharist is placed in the center of a display case, known as a monstrance, in order for the faithful to gaze at Jesus and to pray within his midst. This exposition, or praying before the Eucharist is called Adoration and is one of the most intimate and personal methods of prayer for many Christians.

WEDNESDAYS AT 7:00 PM-Every Wednesday the parish community has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available in the main church from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM. You are invited to come to this hour for as long or as little as you like. Bring your family and friends. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is also offered during this time.

MONDAYS AT 8:15 AM–Join us on Monday mornings following daily Mass for a Holy Hour in our Church sanctuary, 8:15 AM - 9:15 AM. Come start your week in quiet reverence and stillness with the Lord. No reservations necessary. All are welcome to attend.




