March for Life

Each year on (or as close to) January 22, the anniversary of Roe v. Wade (1973), all U.S. dioceses observe a National Day of Prayer & Penance interceding for an end to abortion, an increase in respect for the dignity of all human life, and for the full restoration of the legal protection of the Right to Life. With the unfortunate need to cancel our diocesan pilgrimage to the National March for Life in Washington D.C., members of our Holy Cross family braved the cold temperatures and joined the faithful from across our diocese in prayer at the local March for Life in downtown Syracuse.

Prior to the March, Bishop Lucia led pilgrims in the celebration of the Eucharist followed by a communal Rosary and Holy Hour for

Life. This points to an important takeaway for us as Catholics who often find ourselves facing the wider culture of society: whenever we stand up in defense of our faith, or simply whenever we go out to serve our brothers and sisters in need-how crucial it is that we always do so first nourished in prayer, and whenever possible, having first celebrated together the Eucharist. Then, our joyful witness to the Lord of Life is strengthened to lovingly transform the hearts of anyone we meet. This is how we must always witness: having authentically encountered the Light and Truth of the Gospel.

Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, JANUARY 30, 2022

Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19 Psalm 71:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 15-17 1 Corinthians 12:31 - 13:13 Luke 4:21-30

Today, the concept of love takes center stage in our readings. We hear from Jeremiah that God knew him before he was formed in his mother's womb. He dedicated Jeremiah to being a prophet who will tell the world about God's love and His plan for our ultimate salvation. God goes on to tell Jeremiah that even in the troubles that come from telling people things that they do not want to hear, God will strengthen him and keep him on the right path. If that isn't love, then it is something very close.

In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, we hear about the essence of love. It is patient, kind, humble; qualities that make the way we interact with each other a more sacred and spiritual thing. Love should be something that comes easier to us, but our sin continues to try to break down the bands of love that connect us to one another. That is where Jesus comes in.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the people of his hometown about the love that God wants to show them. They react positively at first, but then, prompted by the familiarity that comes with Jesus' hometown status, they try to throw him off a cliff. In this scene we see an ominous precursor to the cross and painful death that Jesus will endure in order to show us the true love that Paul speaks about. This self-giving love that Jesus shows us is something that we can emulate if we choose to do so. It is not easy to do because of our sinful nature. This type of love has been shown to us by many saints of our church who gave generously of themselves in loving sacrifice. Let us try to do the same, and in so doing, make our world a more loving place.


Sunday, January 30th
