Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 20, 2022

1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 8, 10, 12-13 1 Corinthians 15:45-49 Luke 6:27-38

One of the greatest forces in the world is love. If any of us would seek the Kingdom of God, we must embrace the concept of love in order to accomplish our goal. We know that there is a lot of hate in our world, and that hate is something that is an anathema to love. But God's people must be loving and peaceful people who are tuned in to the words and deeds of Jesus, who is God incarnate. We see examples of how love is accomplished in our readings for today.

In the first reading from Samuel, David has been chased from one end of Israel to the other by the anger of King Saul. He now has an opportunity to put his misery to an end by taking Saul's life. Holding Saul's spear, and watching him sleep, David and his friend Abishai ponder that possibility. But David is moved not by hate and anger, but by love when he decides to take Saul's spear and water jug as evidence of his ability to kill Saul if he had chosen to.

In the Gospel, Jesus lays it all out for us. If we ever needed to be shown how to love, then this passage from Luke's Gospel does it very clearly. We need to do good to those who hate us. We need to pray for those who mistreat us. If someone hits us, we need to invite them to hit us again. These are the acts of someone who loves. These seem like impossible things to do, don't they? But Jesus is not just someone who talks about doing these things, he actually did them. In his passion and crucifixion, we see him beaten mercilessly and he just kept on taking it. He did this to show us that love is not only possible, but it is the only way to defeat hate. We can see that it is a hard thing to do, but, with Jesus' example of love, we can get it done, and earn the joy of heaven as well.

REVIEW OF OLD BUSINESS:

- Soliciting input from parishioners regarding future planning. A survey will be conducted in April.
- Youth program interaction with parishioners and HCPC.

NEW BUSINESS INCLUDED:

- Hope Appeal exceeded the goal of \$92,000, reaching \$170,000. The overage will be returned to the parish.
- Scheduling council member elections.
- Distribution of Lenten booklets by Holy Cross School students.
- Synod Listening Session topics which have been brought up within diocesan sessions:

Latin Mass, bringing the Word to young families, non-Catholics receiving Communion, promoting the sacredness of the earth, increased role of Laity in church (especially women), ecumenical councils, PCA roles in communities, welfare of young priests, sense of church community, lapsed Catholics, shortage of priests/vocation promotion, Church's tradition, priest's responsibilities, Old and New Testament, Catholic beliefs, educating people, inclusion and diversity, tradition vs. change to meet the needs of Catholics (what to keep and what to let go of), LGBTQ, sacraments, respect for the Eucharist, family catechesis and faith formation.

Parish Book Study

This Lent, we wanted to do something special as an entire parish community. Fr. Foley will be leading a parish wide study of **Searching For and Maintaining Peace** – **A Small Treatise on Peace of Heart** written by Father Jacques Philippe.

We live in a day and age characterized by an extraordinary amount of agitation and lack of peace. This tendency manifests itself in our spiritual as well as our secular life. In our search for God and holiness, in our service to our neighbor, a kind of restlessness and anxiety take the place of the confidence and peace which ought to be ours. This is what is taught in this simple, yet profound little treatise on peace of heart. It feels now more timely than ever given the restlessness of the past few years.

Parishioners will be able to pick up a copy of the book at the start of Lent. Fr. Foley will lead us in weekly reading guides and opportunities for Adoration and reflection throughout Lent.
