Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, MARCH 6, 2022

Deuteronomy 26:4-10 Psalm 91:1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15 Romans 10:8-13 Luke 4:1-13

All people experience temptation. Jesus was no exception to this. The temptation that Jesus faced allows us to realize that He was both fully human and fully divine. Temptation often leads us into sin, which in turn, becomes habit or addiction. Christ, however, did not succumb to temptation, but used it as a tool to teach us how to live better and holier lives.

Lent is a time when we are given the opportunity to look deeply at ourselves, not only at what we have done since the past Easter, but also, throughout our entire life. What do we need to change within ourselves? This question is never easy to ask because it goes to the heart of who we are and who we have become. The other obstacle to change that I personally experience, is that I assume there will always be more time to change. I convince myself that there will be another Lenten Season, another time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, another chance to apologize to those whom I have hurt or offended, and ultimately another Easter Season within which we can experience Resurrection.

This year, let us not assume God's mercy and the gift of unending time, but let us realize that God is merciful, and that we should not waste our God-given time wallowing in sinful ways. Let us shed those sins in favor of walking with Christ; our heads held high.

Lenten Reminders

Catholics ages 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and Good Friday (April 15) as well as on all Fridays during Lent.

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast (eat only one full meal; two smaller meals may be taken but may not be equal to the one full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When possible, the fast from Good Friday should continue until the Easter Vigil. This is called the "Paschal Fast." It is done to enter into the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare more fully to celebrate his Resurrection.




