Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, JUNE 5, 2022

Acts 2:1-11

Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

John 20:19-23

Celebrating Pentecost always makes me think of the Sacrament of Confirmation. When we receive Confirmation, the Bishop says: "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit," recalling the special gift of the Holy Spirit that we first received at Baptism. We should be encouraged that those words of the Bishop are just as definitive as our Baptism: the gift of the Holy Spirit has been given to us in a very permanent, life-changing way!

Sometimes, though, we may wonder what our relationship with the Holy Spirit really looks like, or where the Holy Spirit is in the midst of our lives. I invite you to consider the possibility that the Holy Spirit is much more present and active in your life than you may initially think! Perhaps this would be a good way for you and I to observe Pentecost this year: to spend the next week praying daily about where the Holy Spirit has been present in our lives and deepening our openness to the Holy Spirit. Openness to the Holy Spirit brings faith in Christ, as we hear in our second reading: "No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit."

How do we recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit? We are told in Galatians 5:23 that "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." What a wonderful list! During this week, I encourage you to pray each day, briefly reflecting and asking the Lord to help you see where you encountered these fruits in your day, both in others and also in yourself. St. Paul assures us that these are 'fruits of the Holy Spirit,' indicating the presence of the Holy Spirit in our life and, indeed, very much at work right in our own hearts. And if one of these fruits is noticeably absent from your life, ask the Holy Spirit to cultivate it and teach it to you. Let us be open and respond to that grace which we received in Baptism and Confirmation! "Veni, Sancte Spiritus" - Come Holy Spirit!


Sandwich Ministry TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 2022 | 8:15 AM

CALLED BY NAME

This weekend which typically is the weekend our diocese celebrates our priestly ordinations, the Diocese of Syracuse invite you to participate in a new vocation promotion initiative, "CALLED BY NAME." It helps invite men and women to consider a vocation as a priest, sister, brother or deacon. All of us share a common calling through Baptism, to which we are invited to respond in a variety of ways - marriage, single life, consecrated life and ordained ministry. The CALLED BY NAME process focuses on priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life and stresses the role of the Christian community in calling forth men and women to consider these vocations. Parishioners throughout the diocese are encouraged to consider who in our midst might serve well as a priest, deacon, or religious and submit their names to our parish. There are many good prospective priests, brothers, and sisters who are simply waiting to be asked. The following qualities are desirable in persons identified as potential candidates:

- A person of prayer who loves the Lord
- A person who is actively involved in the life of the Church
- A person who is successful in life, including school, work, and relationships
- A "people person"
- A person with personal integrity, honesty, generosity

How does CALLED BY NAME work? Parishioners are invited to submit names of potential candidates from our parish using the response cards available at the church entrances. Our parish staff and clergy will review submissions and persons nominated will be invited to the Tenth Hour, Bishop Lucia's annual Vocations Picnic held every first Wednesday of August at Christ the King Retreat House in Syracuse. Here, participants will learn about each of the vocations while having the opportunity to seek answers to their questions and explore the discernment process further. It remains so very important that we actively support and promote a future generation of priests, religious sisters and brothers, and deacons to serve a growing Church, hungering for Christ in the Eucharist. God continues to call people to serve Him in our world today. The faithful have a responsibility to help identify and invite those called.
