Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, JUNE 19, 2022

Genesis 14:18-20 Psalm 110:1, 2, 3, 4 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Luke 9:11 b-17

In today's Gospel from Luke, we see the Twelve come to Jesus and ask him to "dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here."

We can find much meaning in this scene from Luke. Jesus is present! The Twelve are present with Jesus, and the crowd has apparently journeyed from a long distance in order to hear Jesus and witness any miracles that might take place. This speaks of the intense belief and longing the people in the crowd have for Jesus and his healings.

The Twelve find themselves concerned for the crowd and Jesus tells the Twelve, "Give them some food yourselves." Jesus, in this action, reminds us that he will institute the Eucharist for all who long to eat the food of eternal life, and that the Twelve, representing the Church, are to feed those who hunger through the action of Jesus. The Twelve are concerned with the earthly need to nourish the body. Jesus is concerned with the need to nourish the soul. The message to the Twelve is that they are to take responsibility not only for feeding their own faith life, but the faith life of others; those who long for nourishment from above.

We, as Church, continue this celebration of these words spoken by Jesus each time we break bread at the Eucharistic Feast, instituted by Christ. I wonder, at times, if we really contemplate the miracle that is taking place before our eyes on the table of the Altar. Do we as believers truly appreciate the sacrifice that Christ has made for us, and that the Eucharistic Food we consume is truly the Body and Blood of Christ? If we approach the Eucharist in a casual way, we lessen the effects the Eucharist can have on us.

CALLED BY NAME

The Diocese of Syracuse invite you to participate in a new vocation promotion initiative, "CALLED BY NAME." It helps invite men and women to consider a vocation as a priest, sister, brother or deacon. All of us share a common calling through Baptism, to which we are invited to respond in a variety of ways - marriage, single life, consecrated life and ordained ministry. The CALLED BY NAME process focuses on priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life and stresses the role of the Christian community in calling forth men and women to consider these vocations. Parishioners throughout the diocese are encouraged to consider who in our midst might serve well as a priest, deacon, or religious and submit their names to our parish. There are many good prospective priests, brothers, and sisters who are simply waiting to be asked. The following qualities are desirable in persons identified as potential candidates:

- A person of prayer who loves the Lord
- A person who is actively involved in the life of the Church
- A person who is successful in life, including school, work, and relationships
- A "people person"
- A person with personal integrity, honesty, generosity

How does CALLED BY NAME work? Parishioners are invited to submit names of potential candidates from our parish using the response cards available at the church entrances. Our parish staff and clergy will review submissions and persons nominated will be invited to the Tenth Hour, Bishop Lucia's annual Vocations Picnic held every first Wednesday of August at Christ the King Retreat House in Syracuse. Here, participants will learn about each of the vocations while having the opportunity to seek answers to their questions and explore the discernment process further. It remains so very important that we actively support and promote a future generation of priests, religious sisters and brothers, and deacons to serve a growing Church, hungering for Christ in the Eucharist. God continues to call people to serve Him in our world today. The faithful have a responsibility to help identify and invite those called. Please pray for the success of this initiative and consider whom in our midst God might be calling to serve.
