Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, JULY 3, 2022

Isaiah 66:10-14c

Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20

Galatians 6:14-18 Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Our readings this weekend share a common theme of Joy! In the first reading, we are instructed to "Rejoice with Jerusalem," while our Psalm exclaims, "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy," and in the Gospel the seventy-two disciples "returned rejoicing" after their successful ministry. At its heart, the Christian life is indeed a life of joy! The Holy Spirit fills our hearts and souls with joy, drawing us out of ourselves and into communion with Christ and his Church.

At first glance, then, it would seem that our second reading is out of place. In it, Paul is talking about the Cross and suffering, while all the other readings have a light and joyful tone. Is this a mistake?

The gospel truth, though, is that the Cross and joy go together. This is not intuitive, but it is at the heart of the Gospel and the foundation of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. As Christians, we are not scandalized by the Cross, nor can we try to avoid it in our own lives. Paul goes even further, claiming that we even boast in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, because it is the sign of his victory, and the means of our salvation.

I find that when I try to avoid the Cross in my own life I still end up unhappy, robbed of my joy. This can happen, for example, when I avoid making time for prayer, or sharing my faith, or standing up for what I believe. But when you and I choose to embrace the Cross in our own lives by humbly accepting the various sufferings and trials that come with sincere discipleship, we are surprised to discover a profound joy where we only expected difficulty. It is a joy that comes from trusting in Jesus, who never leaves us to suffer alone, but is always present anywhere that the Cross is.

CALLED BY NAME

The Diocese of Syracuse invite you to participate in a new vocation promotion initiative, "CALLED BY NAME." It helps invite men and women to consider a vocation as a priest, sister, brother or deacon. All of us share a common calling through Baptism, to which we are invited to respond in a variety of ways - marriage, single life, consecrated life and ordained ministry. The CALLED BY NAME process focuses on priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life and stresses the role of the Christian community in calling forth men and women to consider these vocations. Parishioners throughout the diocese are encouraged to consider who in our midst might serve well as a priest, deacon, or religious and submit their names to our parish. There are many good prospective priests, brothers, and sisters who are simply waiting to be asked. The following qualities are desirable in persons identified as potential candidates:

- A person of prayer who loves the Lord
- A person who is actively involved in the life of the Church
- A person who is successful in life, including school, work, and relationships
- A "people person"
- A person with personal integrity, honesty, generosity

How does CALLED BY NAME work? Parishioners are invited to submit names of potential candidates from our parish using the response cards available at the church entrances. Our parish staff and clergy will review submissions and persons nominated will be invited to the Tenth Hour, Bishop Lucia's annual Vocations Picnic held every first Wednesday of August at Christ the King Retreat House in Syracuse. Here, participants will learn about each of the vocations while having the opportunity to seek answers to their questions and explore the discernment process further. It remains so very important that we actively support and promote a future generation of priests, religious sisters and brothers, and deacons to serve a growing Church, hungering for Christ in the Eucharist. God continues to call people to serve Him in our world today. The faithful have a responsibility to help identify and invite those called. Please pray for the success of this initiative and consider whom in our midst God might be calling to serve.



Ukrainian Relief Drive Thank You

Thank you Holy Cross for your immense generosity during the Ukrainian Relief Drive! Holy Cross Girl Scout Cadette Troop 60500 was able to sort and box approximately 20 boxes or about 1600 items collected from Holy Cross Church and School, the Jamesville-DeWitt area, and from the troop. This was combined with approximately 80 additional boxes, for a total of about 100 boxes of food, clothing, medical supplies, and hygiene supplies collected across 24 counties in New York State as part of the Girl Scouts of NYPENN Pathways area.
