## **Readings & Reflection**

### **SUNDAY, JULY 10, 2022**

Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Psalm 69:14, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37

Colossians 1:15-20 Luke 10:25-37

Today's message from the Book of Deuteronomy should touch us in a way that perhaps other Sacred Scripture does not. In chapter 30, verses 10-14, Moses reminds us that we may say that we seek and search for the words of God for guidance in how we interact with one another and for the deliverance from sin. In reality, God has already emblazoned in our heart and on our minds his commands. Why would we not recognize this? To understand and carry out the Word of God, we must take Moses' message to us today to heart.

I occasionally find that when faced with doing something that I know is right I often fail to do the right thing. When I fail to act appropriately, I then look for the excuse as to why. I believe that many people act in this way. We look for an excuse not to know the desires of God because God's desires may not be our desires. It is only out of recognition of and obedience to the commands of God the Father that we live as we ought. It is sin and the natural human desire to serve one's own needs, which get in the way of carrying out the desires of God the Father.

Jesus brings this concept forth in today's Gospel of Luke by addressing the question "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" The answer is "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." The man who asks the question of Jesus knows this is difficult, and therefore goes on to ask "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus could have answered this question easily by saying "everyone is your neighbor, because they are children of God."

### **Adoration**

"Be still and know that I am God."

- PSALM 46:11

#### WHAT IS ADORATION?

From the earliest teachings of the Church, the Catholic Church has understood that Jesus, on the last night of his life, took bread and wine and in a literal way changed it into his actual Body and Blood. He commanded the Apostles to continue to do this in his memory. The cornerstone of the Early Church will become the continual practice of doing this fulfilled Passover meal, and it will come to be known as "the Mass." From the last night of Jesus's life, the Church has continually, for over 2,000 years, celebrated this mystery of changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Even today, the Church teaches that the Eucharist is no symbol, but actually God himself. The Church developed a special time of prayer with the Eucharist. Taking a piece of consecrated host, the Eucharist is placed in the center of a display case, known as a monstrance, in order for the faithful to gaze at Jesus and to pray within his midst. This exposition, or praying before the Eucharist is called Adoration and is one of the most intimate and personal methods of prayer for many Christians.

#### WEDNESDAY EVENINGS

Every Wednesday the parish community has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available in the main church from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM. You are invited to come to this hour for as long or as little as you like. This will be a great opportunity during the week to spend some quiet time with the Lord. The hour will conclude with Evening Prayer from the Divine Office at 7:45 PM followed by Solemn Benediction at 8:00 PM. Bring your family and friends. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) is also offered during this time.

#### **MONDAY MORNINGS**

Join us on Monday mornings following daily Mass for a Holy Hour in our church sanctuary, 8:15 AM - 9:15 AM. Come start your week in quiet reverence and stillness with the Lord. No reservations necessary. All are welcome to attend.

#### YOUTH DISCIPLESHIP GROUPS

#### **SACRAMENTAL PREP - 2ND GRADE**

In the Diocese of Syracuse, preparation and celebration for the Sacraments of First Penance and First Eucharist typically take place during second grade and have certain requirements as set by the pastor and the bishop. These include at-home workbook lessons, group workshops, parent

meetings, and continued participation in Faith Formation or attendance at a Catholic school\*. First Penance takes place in the fall, while First Eucharist takes place in the spring.

\*A prerequisite to First Penance and First Eucharist Prep is that students have attended a Catholic school or participated in a Faith Formation program in first grade.

## CONFIRMATION DIRECT PREP -

In the Diocese of Syracuse, Confirmation preparation takes place during a teen's sophomore year of high school and has certain requirements as set by the bishop. These include group sessions, attendance at a retreat, service projects, and

continued participation in Faith Formation or attendance at a Catholic high school\*.

\*A prerequisite to Confirmation Prep is that students have attended a Catholic school or participated in a Faith Formation program in ninth grade.
