Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, JULY 17, 2022

Genesis 18:1-10a Psalm 15:2-3, 3-4, 5 Colossians 1:24-28 Luke 10:38-42

The theme for our readings this weekend is focused on something we might call spiritual hospitality. In the reading from Genesis, we see Abraham going to great lengths to welcome and comfort some Godly strangers who are passing by his home. In the Gospel, Jesus is at the home of Martha and Mary, two sisters who welcome Jesus in very different ways; Martha as the one who prepares the meals and Mary as the one who sits and listens to Jesus. As we consider the different styles of being hospitable, we recognize that therein lies the important lesson for those of us who want to learn.

Abraham is focused on making sure the three men who visit him are welcomed generously. He brings them water to wash their feet, finds them a comfortable spot in the shade of a tree and arranges for a sumptuous meal to be prepared. At all times, his attention is on the visitors, not on the preparations. Martha is trying to be welcoming, but as she gets drawn into the work that is being done to welcome Jesus, she loses track of him. He is after all, the reason for the welcome. Her focus is somewhat different than Abraham's, who never neglected who he was welcoming. Martha's problems stem from the fact that she got so wrapped up in the work she was doing to be hospitable, that she never truly welcomed her savior.

If we want to be true practitioners of our faith, we must combine the things that we see Martha and Mary doing. In fact, we must emulate the things that Abraham does. We must hear the words that God—in whatever form he takes—is saying to us, and then we must find a way to translate what he has said to us into some form of spiritual action.

Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition



With the permission of Bishop Douglas J. Lucia, Diocese of Syracuse, and our pastor, Father John Kurgan, Holy Cross Church is blessed to host 60 panels of the 180+ Vatican International Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit September 14 - October 16. This is the first exhibit of the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition in our Diocese. Eucharistic Miracles are extraordinary events, where the Eucharist no longer appears under the form of bread and wine but takes on the biological qualities of flesh or blood or both.

What is this exhibit? The panels describe Vatican approved Eucharistic Miracles. The Exhibition was designed and created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young man who died at the age of 15 and was beatified on October 10, 2020. Blessed Carlo's love of his faith and skill with computers led him to study the Eucharistic Miracles and record the information. Over the next few months, we will share more information about the exhibit and Blessed Carlo in preparation for the exhibition this fall at Holy Cross.

YOUTH DISCIPLESHIP GROUPS

SACRAMENTAL PREP - 2ND GRADE

In the Diocese of Syracuse, preparation and celebration for the Sacraments of First Penance and First Eucharist typically take place during second grade and have certain requirements as set by the pastor and the bishop. These include at-home workbook lessons, group workshops, parent

meetings, and continued participation in Faith Formation or attendance at a Catholic school*. First Penance takes place in the fall, while First Eucharist takes place in the spring.

*A prerequisite to First Penance and First Eucharist Prep is that students have attended a Catholic school or participated in a Faith Formation program in first grade.

CONFIRMATION DIRECT PREP - 10TH GRADE

In the Diocese of Syracuse, Confirmation preparation takes place during a teen's sophomore year of high school and has certain requirements as set by the bishop. These include group sessions, attendance at a retreat, service projects, and

continued participation in Faith Formation or attendance at a Catholic high school*.

*A prerequisite to Confirmation Prep is that students have attended a Catholic school or participated in a Faith Formation program in ninth grade.
