Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2022

Amos 8:4-7 Psalm 113:1-2, 4-6, 7-8 1 Timothy 2:1-8 Luke 16:1-13

For whom do we pray? We can ask this question personally of ourselves, and corporately as a parish or Universal Church.

In Saint Paul's Letter to Timothy, Paul addresses the beloved by saying "First of all, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity."

Do we pray in the way that Saint Paul requests, or are our prayers myopic, lacking imagination and often focused just on ourselves, and those whom we know and love? Of course, it is proper and important to pray for ourselves and for those we love, but there is more. We need to have the worldview of which Saint Paul speaks.

At Mass, our Prayer of the Faithful reflects the Church's realization that we need to pray for our government and governments around the world in order to ensure peace and justice. We recognize the importance of praying for individual people who make laws, and for those who enact them. We pray for people of all walks of life and situations, that their lives might be tranquil and full of dignity.

Of course, our personal prayer needs to reflect all of this as well. We all must remember that we are part of the body of Christ, and that what each part of the body does is important to the overall health of the corporate body, the Universal Church.

May we always follow Saint Paul's suggestions as we pray, knowing that this way of prayer is "good and pleasing to God our savior."


