Readings & Reflection

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 27, 2022

Isaiah 2:1-5 Psalms 122: 1-9 Romans 13:11-14 Matthew 24:37-44

We are people on a journey. Just as the pilgrims traveled across the ocean to arrive in Plymouth, we are travelers who have an ultimate destination. But unlike many other pilgrims, we are traveling not to an earthly place- we are traveling to heaven. Our readings today speak to this journey. Isaiah tells us about the Lord's Mountain, a place where we will travel so that God can instruct us in his ways. Those ways include the concept of peace. Our destination will be a place where "one nation shall not raise the sword against another". This is the place where God's justice lives. Because of that justice, we can live lives of faith and joy without any fear. Psalm 122 continues this theme with the phrase; "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

As we journey toward our heavenly destination, we must keep watch over the things around us and over those we care about. Both Paul and Jesus speak of being aware of what is going on around us. We must "throw off the

works of darkness and put on the armor of light". We must "stay awake" and not get too involved in the things of this world, like eating and drinking. Certainly, marrying and giving in marriage are important things but they must be done in the light of our faith, as all things must be done. When we think about the things we spend our time doing, we must recognize those times when we are focused on things of this world and not those of God's world. Otherwise, we will make a wrong turn and find ourselves in a strange an unfamiliar place, rather than on the path to Holiness.

The journey of Advent brings us to the manger. It brings us to a little child who will lead us on our journey. That is enough for us to remember. Jesus will never let us get lost if we follow him closely enough.

After the supreme importance of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, or The Divine Office, is the "official" prayer of the Church. It is the ancient, structured way of praying Scripture throughout the day, especially the Psalms. Clergy, religious, and lay alike make this commitment of prayer as a way of sanctifying the hours of the day, and to answer the call to rejoice, give thanks, and pray without ceasing (1 Thes 5:16-18). This prayer maintains the form of a dialogue that draws us into the presence of God, fueled with the very words and wisdom of God. Sundays during Advent, we will pray Evening Prayer together at 4:40 PM prior to Sunday evening Mass. Consider making this simple, solemn prayer part of your Advent this year!

UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK

In re The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York

Case No. 20-30663

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT, On June 19, 2020, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York, ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The court has established January 17, 2023 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) (the "Supplemental Bar Date") as the deadline to assert claims against the Diocese arising from or relating to abuse that occurred when the survivor was 18 years of age or older, and which, prior to the enactment of the Adult Survivors Act (S.66A/A.648A) would have been subject to a statute of limitations defense ("Adult Claims").

If you have an Adult Claim against the Diocese you must file a claim on or before the Supplemental Bar Date, which will be treated confidentially in accordance with prior court orders in this Case.
