Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, JANUARY 8, 2023

READINGS

Isaiah 60:1-6 Psalms 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13. Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 Matthew 2:1-12

The focus of the feast of the Epiphany is on the Wise Men or Magi. They were royal astronomers who had detected a star in the sky which led them to Jesus.

An interesting theory is that these magi came from Babylon, a country that is noted for the quality of its scholarly pursuits in astronomy. Theologians connect the story of these astronomers who visit Jesus and Daniel the prophet of God who was exiled to Babylon hundreds of years before and who interpreted the dreams of King Nebuchadnezzar. Daniel is said to have been friends with these astronomers who were a kind of Babylonian royalty. Through Daniel's interactions with them, they were made aware of the biblical prophecies and



especially the coming of Jesus as a little child who was destined to save men from their sins.

The prophecies of Isaiah and the writer of Psalm 72 spoke of the coming of caravans of camels and dromedaries which will bring gold and frankincense to the one who will "govern the people with Justice and the afflicted ones with judgment" and "rescue the poor when he cries out." These magi were aware of these prophecies and the star that they followed brought them face to face with Jesus- the one about whom they were focused.

The gospel of Matthew continues this story with the Magi meeting King Herod, who we are told was "greatly troubled" when he heard that someone else could be called the King of

the Jews. No doubt, he was troubled, since he had murdered everyone he thought could share his title. His troubles quickly became the troubles of the people of Judea who Herod would take his anger out on.

What the Epiphany means for us is that Jesus has come for all people, not just those who were of the Jewish



Remembering Pope Benedict XVI

December 31, 2022

Statement of Bishop Douglas J. Lucia of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse on the death of Pope-emeritus Benedict XVI:

This morning, in the final hours of 2022, Catholics throughout the world have learned of the death of Pope-emeritus Benedict XVI. Along with Bishop Robert J. Cunningham, our Bishop-emeritus, I join the Catholic community in mourning the passing of the 265th Successor of St. Peter whose only desire was to be a "humble worker in the vineyard of the Lord." His service in the Church spanned decades both as theologian and pastor and he had a key role to play in the Second Vatican Council as theological advisor to the bishops. Yet, the heart of his ministry would focus on being a true icon of Christ, the deacon - Christ, the servant,

It would be summarized in the three encyclicals of his eight-year pontificate: Deus caritas est – God is Love (2005); Spe Salvi – "In Hope We are Saved" (2007); and Caritas in Veritate – "Charity in Truth" (2009). He was very much aware of his own mission to point out Jesus Christ to others, but like John the Baptist he knew he was not the Christ, and like John knew that he must decrease so that Christ would increase in people's lives (cf. Jn 3:27-36). This awareness would lead Benedict XVI to resign his office as Bishop of Rome and Supreme Pontiff because he recognized his own frailty and inability to continue in that role in 2013.

The years of his pontificate were troublesome ones in the life of the Roman Catholic Church, but what I greatly admired was the Holy Father's humility and gentleness – something I witnessed personally when I met him as Cardinal Ratzinger. Even at World Youth Day in Cologne in 2005, I recognized someone who never wanted limelight for himself, but poured himself out in service of all God's people encouraging them to discover Jesus Christ for themselves and the difference He makes for one's life.

In speaking of this approaching moment in his life, the Pope-emeritus stated: "Quite soon, I shall find myself before the final judge of my life. Even though, as I look back on my long life, I can have great reason for fear and trembling. I am nonetheless of good cheer, for I trust firmly that the Lord is not only the just judge, but also the friend and brother who himself has already suffered for my shortcomings, and is thus also my advocate, my 'Paraclete.'"

I invite you now to join me in praying for the repose of the soul of Pope-emeritus Benedict XVI – that despite the sinful human condition we all share in – he will now come to know firsthand the meaning of the Christmas season we are in – God saves! Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace! Amen.

WHAT IS ADORATION?

From the earliest teachings of the Church, the Catholic Church has understood that Jesus, on the last niaht of his life, took bread and wine and in a literal way changed it into his actual Body and Blood. He commanded the Apostles to continue to do this in his memory. The cornerstone of the Early Church will become the continual practice of doing this fulfilled Passover meal, and it will come to be known as "the Mass." From the last night of Jesus's life, the Church has continually, for over 2,000 years, celebrated this mystery of changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Even today, the Church teaches that the Eucharist is no symbol, but actually God himself. The Church developed a special time of prayer with the Eucharist. Taking a piece of consecrated host, the Eucharist is placed in the center of a display case, known as a monstrance, in order for the faithful to gaze at Jesus and to pray within his midst. This exposition, or praying before the Eucharist is called Adoration and is one of the most intimate and personal methods of prayer for many Christians.

WEDNESDAY EVENINGS

Every Wednesday the parish community has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available in the main church from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM. You are invited to come to this hour for as long or as little as you like. This will be a great opportunity during the week to spend some quiet time with the Lord. The hour will conclude with Evening Prayer from the Divine Office at 7:45 PM followed by Solemn Benediction at 8:00 PM. Bring your family and friends. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) is also offered during this time.

MONDAY MORNINGS

Join us on Monday mornings following daily Mass for a Holy Hour in our church sanctuary, 8:15 AM -9:15 AM. Come start your week in quiet reverence and stillness with the Lord. No reservations necessary. All are welcome to attend.


