### **Sunday Reflection**

SUNDAY, JANUARY 29, 2023

#### **READINGS**

Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13 Psalms 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 Matthew 5:1-12a

The first reading from Zephaniah speaks to us about acting with humility and being honest before the Lord. Those who live by humility and seek the Lord will find shelter in the Lord and uninterrupted rest. In our gospel passage from St Matthew, we have the Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount. As well as being a wellknown passage it is a radical way of living, something that could bring great good to our world but only if people choose to live it. Matthew tells us that the sermon took place on top of a mountain reminding us of Moses, and the fact that Jesus was seated which emphasizes his authority. The connection between this and the first reading is the theme of humility.

St Paul tells us in the second reading

from his second letter to the Corinthians that God often chooses what we regard as something foolish or lowly and turns it into something great. He points to the apostles, sharing with us that none of them was rich or powerful, but their finest quality was to be humble before the Lord. Paul tells us that what the world regards as foolish

and weak is turned into something powerful and transforming by the Lord. If we need an example, let us look no further than the changes that the apostles underwent.

The thing we should focus on in these readings is that there is a way of being—a way of living that can bring us closer to the Lord. If we are humble we can more effectively access the spiritual nature that God seeks of us. If we are meek, if we are poor in spirit, that is, if we realize that our own abilities pale in comparison to God's, then we are truly blessed in our relationship with God. And being blessed is not just being in a good state, but being complete, being whole and being at peace with the universe. These are really good things, and if we seek them through our relationship with God, we are not far from the Kingdom of Heaven. And that Kingdom is where we want to be.

## Rite of Acceptance & Rite of Welcome

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or RCIA (now also known as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, OCIA) is the ancient process through which adults journey together while seeking to be welcomed into full communion with the Catholic Church. RCIA is not a class, nor is it a race to see how much information about the faith individuals can consume over the course of a year or more! Rather, it is primarily about one's relationship with the Lord and how he or she is being invited deeper to share in his body, the Church. Individuals will certainly grow in knowledge of the faith, but also they must grow in prayer so as to deepen their readiness to receive the invitation to the divine life in the Sacraments that Jesus offers to all of us.

This journey is marked by certain rites along the way both for the individuals and for us, the Church they will soon be welcomed into. The timing of these various rites mark their readiness to take the next step and invite our prayerful support as members of their family. This is truly the mission of the Church alive and at work!

Last Sunday at the 5:00 PM evening Mass, we celebrated the Rite of Acceptance and Rite of Welcome, a public display of the desire these individuals have to join the Church. It demonstrates a transition from simply an interested inquirer to active Catechumen (not yet baptized) or Candidate (already baptized). As seen in the intentionality of this rite last Sunday, quite literally, a public step for

these individuals takes place as they physically "cross the threshold" into the Church for the first time to be seen by our community. After their sponsor, a helpful friend and mentor in the faith, introduced them to us, we questioned what it is they are seeking. Their answer is "faith," faith that offers "eternal life." After this initial inquiry, these individuals also receive the Word of God. Each receives a Bible to take for themselves, to be nourished daily with the very Gospel of Jesus Christ. Now, we as the Church take their intent very seriously by assuring them our prayerful support.

This year Holy Cross Church hopes to welcome these individuals whom the Lord has been actively at work helping them to hear his call in their lives. Please greet them warmly and welcome them to our faith community whenever you see them! Above all, please accompany them with your prayers that they may continue to know and be transformed by the Lord's grace already at work within them. They are a gift to us!


