Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, MARCH 12, 2023

READINGS

Exodus 17:3-7 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 John 4:5-42

There is a very important question that is asked at the end of the first reading from the book of Exodus this weekend. It is "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" We ponder that question in different forms and in different ways in our lives and spiritual thoughts. When we hear about something tragic happening to innocent people, we may ask: "where was God in their time of need?" We may ask the same questions when things happen to us as well. What the readings go on to say is that, indeed, our God is always in our midst, even if we are too busy or too stressed to perceive His presence.

The reading from Exodus documents the difficulties of the Israelites in their journey from their place of slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land. They were very thirsty, and water was hard to find, so they complained to Moses. He spoke to God and God made the water flow from the rock so they could slake their thirst. This was a period of testing to see whether God was with His people or not. In fact, He was, and still is, through the presence of his son Jesus and through the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel reflects this theme of water in a wonderful way when Jesus meets a Samaritan woman at a well in Sychar, a small town in Samaria. The woman comes to the well at noon, the hottest time of the day because there are fewer people there at that time. She does this because she is an object of shame and judgment by the people of the town because she has had five husbands and is now living with a man who is not her husband. Her conversation with Jesus is focused on water, but Jesus takes it to a higher level when he tells her about the living water that he gives. This living water is the Holy Spirit which quenches all our thirst for God's love. Let us seek this water through our prayers, fasting and almsgiving during this penitential season of Lent.



Lenten Reminders

Catholics ages 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday (February 22) and Good Friday (April 7) as well as on all Fridays during Lent.

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast (eat only one full meal; two smaller meals may be taken but may not be equal to the one full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When possible, the fast from Good Friday should continue until the Easter Vigil. This is called the "Paschal Fast." It is done to enter into the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare more fully to celebrate his Resurrection.

EARTHQUAKE RELIEF COLLECTION

The death toll has reached over 46,000 people in Turkey and Syria since earthquakes shattered these countries just weeks ago. The recovery efforts have been slow and the devastation is overwhelming. The generous people of our diocese have been asking, how can we help? Catholic Relief Services will support emergency relief efforts led by local partners in both Syria and Turkey with Caritas Internationalis, Caritas Syria in Aleppo and Lattakia—where extensive damage has been reported—and other local partners. Already in Turkey, Caritas Internationalis, in coordination with authorities, is bringing displaced people to safe, open spaces and distributing hot meals and clothing. This weekend, our second collection will go to Earthquake Relief-CRS collection that many parishes in our diocese are participating in this month.

HOSPITALIZED OR HOMEBOUND?


