Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, APRIL 9, 2023

READINGS

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 Psalms 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9

Praised be Jesus Christ! He is risen! Alleluia!

I offer for our consideration the powerful opening of the First Letter of St. John, which begins like this (it sounds a little like the first chapter of John's Gospel):

What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we looked upon and touched with our hands concerns the Word of life—for the life was made visible; we have seen it and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was made visible to us—what we have seen and heard we proclaim now to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; for our fellowship is with the Father and with

his Son, Jesus Christ.We are writing this so that our joy may be complete.

Believe it or not, this reading does not appear in our lectionary at Sunday Mass, but it is an important apostolic testimony to the profound reality of the Resurrection. The Incarnate Lord—God having taken to himself our humanity—really dwelled among us, and he allowed himself to be seen and touched and loved by us. Jesus endured his horrific suffering and death, so that we might come to have eternal life with him and to ever grow in our appreciation for the extent of his love for us. For those who let it, the feast that we celebrate today is forever the cause of our joy, the foundation of our faith, and the only way by which we have life. The Resurrection is the source of all grace, through it we also receive Hope that enables and strengthens us to walk differently amid the darkness of the world. Jesus has overcome the world, and still he has power over death.

This Lent we've had the opportunity to journey through Fr. Jacque Philippe's *Interior Freedom*, in which we learned

some important lessons for understanding the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love. If we only know or understand "hope" from the perspective of the English language, we can be left grasping at something that may or may not be there. This is not Christian hope, nor the kind of hope we receive from the power of the Resurrection. Hope is, as found in the Catechism:

"...[Hope is something] that does not disappoint.' Hope is the 'sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...that enters...where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf.' Hope is also a weapon that protects us in the struggle of salvation" (CCC 1820).

To further simplify, we could say hope is the persevering sense or the steadfast trust given to us to await and expect everything from God especially as it comes to us through the merits of the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus. In other words, hope rooted within us is pervasive confidence in what Jesus has done for us. So one who has the gift of this hope is not wavering in wondering whether or not Jesus has been raised from the dead, but rather is convinced of it, and now allows the implications of Jesus' Resurrection to be the foundation and motivation for everything else in life.

Having hope, one truly enjoys radical interior freedom and the fullness of life here and now. Jesus wants us to know this gift.

Fr. Philippe notes, "It could be said that, while charity is the greatest of the three theological virtues, in practice hope is the most important. As long as hope remains, love develops. If hope is extinguished, love grows cold. A world without hope soon becomes a world without love." As we celebrate anew the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus, may we receive an infusion of divine hope to propel us toward living with greater confidence in Jesus' power over death. May this Hope that we receive again be strength for us to bear his light and life confidently into the world around us, without fear that anything could come and rob us of this amazing freedom.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord,

"He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said" (Mt 28:6). What a scene and message the holy women encountered when "as the first day of the week was dawning" (Mt. 28: 1) they came to see Jesus' tomb. Ultimately although the tomb would be found empty, they would end up meeting Jesus on the way as they were carrying the news to his other disciples.

His message to them in that encounter was simple and direct: "Do not be afraid" (Mt 28: I 0). Think of what this means not only for them, but for his wayward disciples and for you and I. The Risen Lord Jesus is willing to take us as we are and to meet us wherever we might be on the road of life. Even when he catches up with the disciples in Galilee-bearing the marks of his wounds-Jesus' salutation is not a chastisement concerning their behavior over the period of the last three days, but addresses them with the consoling greeting, "Peace be with you."

He commissions then his disciples to carry this message to those whom they meet along the way right down to the present day. In his 2022 Easter Sunday message, Pope Francis declared: "May we be won over by the peace of Christ! Peace is possible; peace is a duty; peace is everyone's primary responsibility."

To be won over by Christ is the source of the new life that the Easter event promises. Like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus who were discouraged and making their exit from Jerusalem, we might feel similarly as we look out at the world in which we live or at our own lives. We might believe that all is hopeless ... that we are hopeless! It is in this moment that the Risen Christ approaches to announce the dawn of a new day – "Behold, I make all things new" (Rv 21:5).

May the new life arising from Christ's Resurrection set your hearts on fire! Happy Easter and be assured of my prayers that Christ's peace will be in your hearts, your homes, and in our world!



Our Story

Our History

Holy Cross parish began as a mission of Our Lady of Solace, in 1943. The mission was founded by then pastor of the parish, Monsignor Edward P. Buttimer. A small house at 4112 East Genesee Street was purchased on October 30, 1942. It became home to the mission church and catechetical center. The first Mass was said on Pentecost Sunday, June 13, 1943.

In May 1944, the property between the house and St. Mary's Cemetery was purchased from Dr. G. Leslie and Miss H. Leslie with the intention of building a church on the site. Because of the scarcity of building materials during World War II, ground was not broken until September 11, 1949, and the church was dedicated on April 23, 1950. In November of that year, Reverend Joseph I. Ritchie was

named as the first pastor, which he held until his death on March 18, 1964.





As DeWitt and the surrounding area developed and grew over the years, so too did the community at Holy Cross. Due to the generosity of this community, Holy Cross saw the expansion and addition of land, buildings, and staff. Construction of a rectory was finished in March of 1951. A convent was added in 1957. And Holy Cross School opened its doors to students in September of 1958.

Our Church Home

Because of continued growth in the area, a new church building was needed to accommodate the people and activities of Holy

Cross. In 2002, then pastor of the parish, Msgr. J. Robert Yeazel and the Parish Council voted unanimously to build a new church. On September 14, 2006, that church was dedicated on the Feast of the Holy Cross.

Today, Holy Cross continues its tradition of being a caring community devoted

to the needs of our families, neighbors, and society. We value our faith and the food God gives us for the journey. We are committed to our families and youth, to providing a safe environment to form their faith. We build our lives in the image of Christ through worship and prayer. We serve and accompany our neighbors in need and those on the margins. We share our faith with others to spread the Gospel. To be faithful stewards of Holy Cross, we are accountable to God for responsibly sharing our time, talents and treasures. We work as a parish to establish and implement our goals and objectives, mindful of our diverse community and ever-changing needs.
