Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2023

READINGS

Ezekiel 18:25-28 Psalms 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9 Philippians 2:1-11 Matthew 21:28-32

What is the call to discipleship; order or invitation? We may be of the opinion that Jesus does not give us a choice in following him. Believing that the call is an order can make us feel that Jesus only makes demands on us, and that those demands limit our personal freedom. This is not true discipleship, but slavery.

Certainly, discipleship places demands on the individual, but we must remember that this does not limit or deny us our freedom. We must decide if we will accept or reject the invitation to become disciples, understanding that choosing to be a Disciple of Jesus requires continued, renewed commitment. However, we should not think of our commitment as a one time, permanent decision. It is

in the daily renewal of our choice to follow Jesus that we gain new energy and insight from our relationship with our Savior.

Jesus' invitation is always open to us, no matter how many times we have accepted or denied the invitation to grasp the hand of Jesus and allow him to accompany us on our journey through life. We should serve him as he pleases, recognizing that we benefit greatly from our relationship. We also must remember that we can withdraw from Jesus, and choose our own way, ignoring his invitation.

During the month of September more than 100 refugees will be arriving in Syracuse. Currently, the shelves in the closet are bare! Please see the donation guidelines below for ways you can help.

CLOTHING GUIDELINES

- Gently used fall & winter clothing /shoes of all types
- Sweatshirts, sweatpants, tops, bottoms, dresses, skirts, sleepwear, coats, rain coats, winter coats, hats, mittens, shoes, sneakers, boots, loafers, etc.
 - (NO socks or underwear. NO Holy Cross uniforms
 these items can go to the school uniform closet)
- Sizes 2T 18 year old (nothing smaller than 2T)
- Washed & folded
- · Sorted by size if possible

Keep in mind, please only donate items that are in a condition you would share with family & friends. It saves time on the sorting process. If you do not have any clothes to donate but would like to help out, the closet is always in need of NEW underwear and athletic socks. Consider placing folded items in big reusable shopping bags. The refugees arrive at the Syracuse airport and their first stop is the clothing closet so the bags come in handy to fill with the supplies they need.

UNITED WAY OF CENTRAL NEW YORK

In the fall of 2022, new state, federal, and local data revealed what many feared – students across the nation are challenged to read. Assessment scores fell significantly.

Sadly, students of color and those living in poverty experienced high rates of illness and death and more prolonged school closures — exacerbating poor reading outcomes that were present before the pandemic. (Source: Ed Trust -NY)


