### **Sunday Reflection**

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2023

### READINGS

Exodus 22:20-26 Psalms 18:2-3, 3-4, 47, 51 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10 Matthew 22:34-40

Today's readings focus on one of the most basic ideas that our faith brings to us; the concept that since we are followers of God, we should reflect that truth in the way we treat one another. It should not matter who we are or what kind of job we have or any other factor in our lives. We should treat everyone like the divine creature they are in God's eyes. When we were created in the image and likeness of God, we were called "good." We should look for this goodness in each other so we can live lives that are worthy of our status as creations that are godlike in appearance and comprehension.

In our first reading from the Book of Exodus the Lord is telling the people how they should behave towards the Sunday Reflections in your inbox; subscribe today!



poor and the stranger. If they are not honest and upright with the poor and less fortunate then the Lord will be angry because he hears the cry of the poor and will answer their cries for justice. In the gospel, the Pharisees are still trying to trick Jesus and yet again they fail. He answers their question regarding the greatest commandment and goes on to tell them that they must love their neighbor as themselves-something they were not happy to do because they saw themselves as being greater than the majority of their neighbors. These readings challenge us to look at ourselves and to see how we treat our neighbors, particularly the poor.

In the end, we need to evaluate the way we perceive others in our world. If we are like the Pharisees and see everyone as inferior to ourselves, then we need to seek a change in our thinking. God's measuring stick is much higher than ours, but we still need to try to change our hearts SEE **REFLECTION**, **PAGE 6**

### THE MASS

The Mass is our participation in the one perfect Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross. The Mass is our participation in true communion with God and one another. And the Mass is our taste on this earth of the full perfection we will experience in the Kingdom of Heaven.

### HOLY WATER

Why are there holy water fonts located near the entrance of the church? Msgr. Peter Elliott explains, "The holy water [fonts] at the doors of the church are signs which recall the baptismal washing of the faithful." Their location just inside the church doors recalls for us our entrance into the life of the Church when we were baptized with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. As you enter the body of the church, you bless yourself with holy water to recall the sacrament through which you entered into God's family, the Church to recommit ourselves to living holy lives in fidelity to Christ, and prepare ourselves to participate fruitfully in the Holy Mass.

Holy water is water blessed by a bishop, priest, or deacon and is among holy things that fall into the category called "sacramentals." They help us recall the graces of the sacraments. They don't confer grace, but prepare us to receive grace and help us to cooperate with those graces to grow in faith and holiness.

## **Council Update**

Parishioners, thank you for your responsiveness in Pastoral Candidate Voting last month. We are happy to welcome Cathy Relihan, Mary Haley, Rita Chanthasenak, Paul Sansone, and Jolie Johnston (Holy Cross School representative) as new Council members. These new members started their terms September 28, joining the following Council members: Karen Markoff (President), William Leiker (Vice-President), Beth Schafer (Secretary), Carl Thomas, Margaret Ingraham, Ron DeLuca and Kay Sgarlata. Non-voting members of the Council are Fr. Kurgan, Fr. Foley, Nina Walters (Holy Cross Principal), and three Holy Cross Trustees: CookieDunham, Tom Griffith, and Claude Pilon. Please feel free to stop any of us if you have questions or suggestions for how we can better serve in our role of facilitating communication between the Pastor and parishioners to enrich and strengthen our Catholic community.

As part of last year's goal "to increase connectivity to Holy Cross through Pastoral Council communication and action steps," we heard parishinoner voices in our survey and shared results with parishioners, then conducting our Talent and Mission weekends. For the latter, I want to personally apologize if any parishioner who volunteered was not contacted by the appropriate coordinator for that mission. All coordinators were provided the list of new volunteers, so if you volunteered for future mission work and were not contacted, please let one of the Pastoral Council members know, or call the Holy Cross Parish Office at 315-446-0473.

I would also ask you to access some valuable information from the Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse website: the Year of Grace Calendar, and information about the Synod/ Eucharistic Revival/Reorganization and the Hope Appeal. Bishop Lucia and Father Kurgan as Vicar General attended well over 45 diocesan listening sessions last year for the Synod. This journey to review our Roman Catholic faith and the future was identified by Pope Francis in 2018 as "..the purpose of the Synod...is not to produce documents, but 'to plant dreams draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands." This sums up what we hope to be able to do in our parish, to hear and support your voices and concerns, making us a vibrant and strong Catholic community!

"Be still and know that I am God."

- PSALM 46:11

### WHAT IS ADORATION?

From the earliest teachings of the Church, the Catholic Church has understood that Jesus, on the last night of his life, took bread and wine and in a literal way changed it into his actual Body and Blood. He commanded the Apostles to continue to do this in his memory. The cornerstone of the Early Church will become the continual practice of doing this fulfilled Passover meal, and it will come to be known as "the Mass." From the last night of Jesus's life, the Church has continually, for over 2,000 years, celebrated this mystery of changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Even today, the Church teaches that the Eucharist is no symbol, but actually God himself. The Church developed a special time of prayer with the Eucharist. Taking a piece of consecrated host, the Eucharist is placed in the center of a display case, known as a monstrance, in order for the faithful to gaze at Jesus and to pray within his midst. This exposition, or praying before the Eucharist is called Adoration and is one of the most intimate and personal methods of prayer for many Christians.

### WEDNESDAYS AT 7:00 PM

Every Wednesday, the parish community has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available in the main church from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM. You are invited to come to this hour for as long or as little as you like. This will be a great opportunity during the week to spend some quiet time with the Lord. The hour will conclude with Evening Prayer from the Divine Office at 7:45 PM followed by Solemn Benediction at 8:00 PM. Bring your family and friends. Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is also offered during this time.

### MONDAY MORNINGS

Join us on Monday mornings following daily Mass for a Holy Hour in the church sanctuary, 8:15 AM -9:15 AM. Come start your week in quiet reverence and stillness with the Lord. No reservations necessary. All are welcome to attend.


