Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2023

READINGS

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 Psalms 85:9-10-11-12, 13-141 2 Peter 3:8-14 Mark 1:1-8

One of the things that seems really obvious in our current time is that we are living through perhaps one of the most tumultuous periods in the history of mankind. With the uncertainty of climate change, with the violence of wars in Ukraine and the Middle East, with plagues, famines, and political unrest, we wonder where we might look for some sense of calm and peace. Well, look no further than the Lord's divine plan for our lives which is depicted in the readings for the Second Sunday of Advent.

Today's readings seem made-to-order for these difficult times we are living through. From the opening line of the Prophet Isaiah, "Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God," to the Psalm, "I will hear what Sunday Reflections in your inbox; subscribe today!



God proclaims; the LORD—for he proclaims peace to his people," to Peter's assurance that God is patient with us, and finally, to the gospel with John proclaiming, "One mightier than I is coming after me," we receive a message of hope and celestial optimism.

All the readings seem to be specifically crafted to address the reality of our world today. These readings can assist us as we are preparing our hearts to welcome Jesus into our world. If the events in our world are causing you grief and anxiety, read and reread the opening lines from Isaiah about comfort. So many of us need comfort right now with all of the chaos and uncertainty we are experiencing.

In all the tumult and craziness of our world there is one thing that we can count on, only one "true north" that we can be guided by. That is the knowledge that God's plan for our

Parish Eucharistic Revival

THE MASS: THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." Once we have finished the entrance hymn or antiphon at the beginning of Mass, there is a familiar gesture we do at every Mass and frequently with our prayers: we make the Sign of the Cross.

The Holy gesture points us to the Cross of Jesus—it reminds us of his saving sacrifice—the place where Jesus gave everything out of love for us to conquer sin and death. The words we say remind us that we have been brought into the life of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Praying in the singular "name" recalls that God is One God in Three Persons.

Repetition of the Sign of the Cross can sometimes lessen our attention to what we are doing and what it means. Maybe imagine what it looked like when Mother Mary, St. Bernadette, or one of the saints made it. Consider moving your hand and saying the words more slowly. Think about the love Jesus has for you as you trace the shape of the cross. Thank God that you have been given a share in the life of the Trinity through Baptism. What a grace-filled gift the Sign of the Cross truly is!


