Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 24, 2023

READINGS

2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16 Psalms 89:2-3, 4-5, 27, 29 Romans 16:25-27 Luke 1:26-38

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, the season shifts from expectation to immediacy. The introduction of the "O Antiphons" on the Seventeenth of December prepares us for this coming shift. The "O Antiphons" are prayed for seven days in preparation for Christmas and are based on Isaiah's prophesies and reveal the different titles given to the Messiah. This shift helps us realize that the Christ Child has almost arrived among us.

The Scripture readings for this weekend describe that the time of fulfillment is at hand. God the Father has revealed the mystery hidden from our eyes. We can only say that God works what seems impossible, and he does this for the benefit of all humankind! Sunday Reflections in your inbox; subscribe today!



As the waiting of Advent is nearly over. Mary and we are to believe that God has done the impossible. Mary is to believe that she will be the mother of the Lord, but also, to believe that her kinwoman Elizabeth is with child. This is all because nothing is impossible for God.

Do we somehow attribute those miracles to our own doing? This is the perfect time to explore how God is active in our life!

Council Update

Parishioners,

Reminding you of Pastoral Council's goal "to increase parishioner connection to Holy Cross through our work," we have been discussing ways we can support the National Eucharistic Revival and share thoughts with the Syracuse Diocesan Pastoral Council. The Syracuse Diocese has perhaps best defined this work through its definition of evangelization: "It is bringing people into a relationship with Jesus. We are invited to discover Jesus through a personal encounter with him, follow Jesus by becoming his disciple, and proclaim the good news to be a witness of Jesus." Being the year for Eucharistic Revival, the Council spent time discussing Adoration and Mass Participation with the Eucharist and how we can invite and welcome increased participation.

The Council has suggested the sharing of short videos and personal Holy Cross parishioner testimonials about experiences of Adoration and the worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Council members discussed the value of listening, reflecting, and hearing Jesus' message and experiencing his love for us as he accompanies us on our earthly journey. They also want to hear from you about ways we can best welcome post-Covid people back to church, how we can best provide lay assistance to our priests, how we can best connect and support new community members and baptized parishioners, and could/should we designate a day per month intended for us to pray together for peace/special intentions and reflection with Jesus Christ? If you have thoughts and suggestions about these areas, please share them with a Council member before or after Mass.

Parish Eucharistic Revival

THE MASS: PENITENTIAL ACT

During the entrance rite, we recall that we are in the presence of God. If we are truly sincere in realizing that God is in our midst, then we recognize the need for purification. We recognize that when we encounter God, we must draw near with a pure heart. So, we call to mind our sins and failings, and we ask the Lord to forgive and heal us. After our time of silence, the priest (or deacon) leads the community in prayer.

This honest look inside ourselves helps us to be aware of our sin and our need for God to help us overcome sin. This brief reflection recalls the places in our lives where we know we need Christ more. This might be a great time to ask specifically for help in overcoming a particular sin or perhaps further healing from the effects of previous sins. We believe that the Mass is our most powerful prayer because Jesus himself is truly present, joining together with Him in the perfect worship of God the Father. In the Mass we take part in the perfect sacrifice of the Cross where Christ offered Himself so that our sins could be forgiven. Realizing Jesus will be present on the altar or thinking about how the Mass is a sharing in the Cross, this moment can actually be one of great hope. What a great gift!


