Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2024

READINGS

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18 Psalms 116:10, 15, 16-17, 18-19 Romans 8:31b-34 Mark 9:2-10

This Sunday's readings speak to God's awesome benevolence. While we could never envision ourselves sacrificing one of our children in order to show God that we love him, we need to recognize that this is exactly what God did for us-he offered up his only and beloved son so we could have freedom from sin.

In the first reading from Genesis, God tells Abraham to take his son Isaac to a land called Moriah and sacrifice him as a test of how much Abraham loves him. Abraham takes his son on this journey and just as he raises his knife to carry out God's request he is told to stop. He has passed the test of love for God.

In the second reading from the letter to the Romans, we are reminded that God gave up his only Son for our sake so that we might have eternal life once again, and that this Son now sits at God's right hand to plead for us.

In the gospel, we read St Mark's account of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Christ was seen in dazzling white robes in a foretaste of godliness and purity. For a few moments, the awesome truth that Jesus is God is there for all to see. This moment of Transfiguration gives us a clear picture of who Jesus truly is; he is the beloved son of the one and only God. The presence of Moses and Elijah brings the picture into full clarity–Jesus is the very incarnation of God as a human being and is every bit as precious and loved as a son could be. His father's words of love echo through the reading as God says; "This is my beloved son, listen to him."

Our readings today bring us the realization that God's sacrifice of his only Son was done out of his great love for us. Our response to this incredible news should be one of great joy and appreciation that we are made clean by the death and resurrection of Jesus. Let us always remember the sacrifice that God offered for us.

Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible bible study beginning in lent

Many Catholics want to read the Bible because they know it is God's Word, but they give up because it seems so complicated. Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible helps you get the "big picture" by showing how fourteen narrative books of the Bible tell the complete story from Adam and Eve to Christ and the Church. Presenter Jeff Cavins shows you how to read the Bible so that you can actually understand it.

Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible will help you discover the story of salvation history and understand how you fit into God's plan. This eight-session study program includes video presentations that explore all twelve time periods of The Bible, followed by a engaging small group discussion led by one of our facilitators.

Parish Eucharistic Revival THE MASS: INTERCESSIONS

As a conclusion to the Liturgy of the Word, we pray together, asking God for our needs. This part of the Mass has several names, including the Prayer of the Faithful, General Intercessions, Universal Prayer, or Petitions. They are prayed in a general way, typically following a pattern of praying for the needs of the Church, for public authorities and the salvation of the world, for those burdened by any kind of difficulty, and for the local community. Often, the final intercession will include prayers for the deceased. While these prayers are envisioned to be "general," the General Instruction of the Roman Missal does note that for a particular celebration like a Confirmation or a wedding, "the series of intentions may be concerned more closely with the particular occasion" (GIRM, 70). After the series of petitions, the Prayer of the Faithful ends with the concluding prayer said by the priest, asking God to accept our petitions.

Praying together as Christians has been part of our life from the beginning. As Charles Belmonte notes, "To pray for the needs of the Church and the world is an early Christian custom. St. Paul admonishes Timothy, one of his disciples: 'First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity.' (1 Tim 2:1-2)" (Understanding the Mass, p. 104). This part of the Mass stretches back to those earliest descriptions of the Mass, including the one by St. Justin Martyr (+165 AD).

Having just listened to God's Word and professed together our Faith through the Creed, we are then standing united in faith as we ask God for what we need. Jesus has told us that our prayers are powerful when even two agree on intentions (Matthew 18:19). How powerful is our prayer when the whole Church is joined together in union.

Council Update

Dear Parishioners,

The Council continues to work and discuss Adoration and Eucharistic Revival, especially in preparation for Lenten devotion. The Council encourages all parishioners to participate in the many Lenten services: morning Masses, Adoration, Sunday Masses, Stations of the Cross (Fridays), Penance, Bible study, and Holy Week. We will be presenting short videos on Adoration, including one being planned by our new Youth Council member, Alaina DiBiase to emphasize the importance of strengthening our relationship with Christ. Father Kurgan focused on this in Sunday's homily–asking all of us to reflect on, and to build, our relationship with prayer and Christ during the upcoming Lenten season.

Additionally, we are adding an annual event for Holy Cross. Prior to Cookie Dunham's death, (a Holy Cross trustee) Cookie asked me for any yarn I might have for her sister, Sister Mary Obrist, and the Franciscan nuns at the Villa. I periodically visit Joanne Fabrics to purchase skeins of yarn for the sisters who knit hats for the newborns at St. Joseph's Hospital. In memory of Cookie and the nuns who continue their charitable service by knitting for newborn and youth for the hospital and our diocese, the Council will have a yarn drive every February. If success exceeds the nuns' needs, we will share yarn with our own Holy Cross knitting group and others who knit for newborns and youth. So, if you have odds and ends of yarn or happen to buy a few skeins of yarn, please distribute them in the box at the entrance. We will be collecting yarn through March 17. Thank you in advance for helping us remember Cookie and the many sisters who continue to serve our community!

May God Bless us all as we identify our Lenten goals and journey to keep them through the Lenten season.


