
1944 - 2024

Ernest Joseph Camerota, 79, passed away on February 29, 2024 at his home in Minoa, NY. He was born in Syracuse to Joseph and Lorraine Camerota on November 8, 1944.

Ernie graduated from St. John the Evangelist High School and went on to pursue his passion for music at Syracuse University, where he earned his Bachelor degree in Music Composition and Piano with a minor in Organ. Music was his life's work. His musical talents were noticed at a very early age as he sang on the radio at the age of two and traveled the country performing on the Horace Height TV show (at 3-7 year of age) with our parents by his side on guitar and accordion. He lived for several years in NYC working for ASCAP. He taught Chorus and Music Theory at Bishop Grimes High School. He was a member of the American Guild of Organists.

God gifted Ernie with an incredible musical talent. Having perfect pitch and the ability to hear a song just once and be able to sit at the piano and play it was just a sampling of his skills. He could also listen to an arrangement or orchestration and accurately write out all of the parts. He served as organist and choir director at several churches; but has spent the last nearly 40 years proudly as Director of Music at Holy Cross Roman Catholic Church in Dewitt, NY. Over the years, Ernie developed and directed a Folk Choir, Children's Choir (for which he wrote many musical pieces) as well as the full Sunday Choir. He earned the love and respect of the entire Holy Cross community.

Predeceased by his parents, Ernie is survived by his sister, Maurita Marley and husband Michael and brother Eugene Camerota and wife Laurie; along with several nieces and nephews.

Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, MARCH 10, 2024

READINGS

2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23 Psalms 137:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6 Ephesians 2:4-10 John 3:14-21

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we celebrate Laetare Sunday. The term Laetare is derived from the opening words of the Latin Mass, "Rejoice (Laetare) Jerusalem" (Is 66:10), which calls the church to joyful anticipation of the victory of Christ over death.

The primary theme in today's readings is the mercy of God. As we ponder the meaning of joyful anticipation, we should consider this theme of mercy from three aspects: God is rich in mercy; God's mercy lifts us up; and the Blessings of God flow from God's Mercy.

As faithful Catholic Christians, God calls us to be open to His mercy in all of its forms. I hope that we realize that even though we may not believe we are deserving of God's love and

mercy, it can lift us up out of times of despair when sin and weakness seem overwhelming.

God's mercy is abundant and available to us if we choose to allow it to work within us. This Lent let us open ourselves to the great mercies of God the Father. With Jesus Christ's victory over death comes our victory over death as well!

Lenten Reminders

Catholics ages 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday as well as on all Fridays during Lent.

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast (eat only one full meal; two smaller meals may be taken but may not be equal to the one full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When possible, the fast from Good Friday should continue until the Easter Vigil. This is called the "Paschal Fast." It is done to enter into the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare more fully to celebrate his Resurrection.

Parish Eucharistic Revival

THE MASS: ALTAR SETUP

After the Liturgy of the Word, we sit down while the preparations for the Liturgy of the Eucharist take place. The General Instruction for the Roman Missal reminds us that certain items are needed for the Liturgy of the Eucharist (GIRM, 117–118):

- Two to six lighted candles
- A crucifix on or near the altar (the altar should be covered by a white cloth)
- The Missal. This book contains words in black, words that the priest says, and red ink, instructions for the priest.
- Corporal: This is a square white cloth that is unfolded and placed on the altar.
- Chalice: This special cup is made of precious metals (generally gold-plated or silver-plated) to honor Jesus.
- Purificator: This is a long, narrow white cloth used to wipe the rim of the chalice.
- Paten: This item which looks like a small plate is also generally gold-plated or silver-plated and is used for the large host which the priest holds up during the Eucharistic Prayer.
- Ciborium: This is another gold or silver-plated item that has a matching lid and which holds the smaller hosts. When hosts are reserved in the tabernacle, they are typically kept in a ciborium.
- Pall: This is a square white cloth stiffened with cardboard that is used to cover the chalice. This cover prevents other things from getting into the chalice.
- Chalice veil: This is a cloth cover for the chalice. It not only can protect the chalice when not in use, but it also helps heighten our sense of mystery.

There are many items used for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, each with purpose and meaning.

Adoration

"Be still and know that I am God."

WHAT IS ADORATION?

From the earliest teachings of the Church, the Catholic Church has understood that Jesus, on the last night of his life, took bread and wine and in a literal way changed it into his actual Body and Blood. He commanded the Apostles to continue to do this in his memory. The cornerstone of the Early Church will become the continual practice of doing this fulfilled Passover meal, and it will come to be known as "the Mass." From the last night of Jesus's life, the Church has continually, for over 2,000 years, celebrated this mystery of changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Even today, the Church teaches that the Eucharist is no symbol, but actually God himself. The Church developed a special time of prayer with the Eucharist. Taking a piece of consecrated host, the Eucharist is placed in the center of a display case, known as a monstrance, in order for the faithful to gaze at Jesus and to pray within his midst. This exposition, or praying before the Eucharist is called Adoration and is one of the most intimate and personal methods of prayer for many Christians.

WEDNESDAYS AT 7:00 PM

Every Wednesday, the parish community has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available in the main church from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM. You are invited to come to this hour for as long or as little as you like. This will be a great opportunity during the week to spend some quiet time with the Lord. The hour will conclude with Evening Prayer from the Divine Office at 7:45 PM followed by Solemn Benediction at 8:00 PM. Bring your family and friends. Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is also offered during this time.

MONDAY MORNINGS

Join us on Monday mornings following daily Mass for a Holy Hour in the church sanctuary, 8:15 AM - 9:15 AM. Come start your week in quiet reverence and stillness with the Lord. No reservations necessary. All are welcome to attend.


