Sunday Reflection

SUNDAY, MARCH 31, 2024

READINGS

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 Psalms 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9

He is risen! The Easter Season is the time of mystagogical catechesis, which allows us to experience the sacraments of initiation through those who have participated in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and have now entered the church through Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

Those of us previously fully initiated into the Church have the opportunity at Easter Mass to renew our own Baptismal promises. This vital part of Easter Mass reminds us that Baptism truly means new life! We may ask; to what newness of life does Christ call us? Newness of life in Christ is our answer! For us to be able to accept this newness of life means that we must die to ourselves, our habits, sinful desires in order to accept resurrection in Christ.

Christ's salvific action for us is the source of new life. We first see this new life in his resurrection on the third day, which we celebrate on this Easter Sunday. This transformation from physical death to new life plays out before our eyes on Easter. The renewal of our baptismal promises reminds us that we, baptized into Christ's death, will rise to new life when the struggles of this world are completed.

Each Sunday of Easter Sacred Scripture allows us to experience what this new life can be like. Each Sunday's readings concentrate on some aspect of the mystery of the sacraments of initiation that lead us into new life in Christ. Let us pray for ourselves and for each other, that we remain open to Christ's salvific action this Easter Season.

WHAT IS ADORATION?

From the earliest teachings of the Church, the Catholic Church has understood that Jesus, on the last night of his life, took bread and wine and in a literal way changed it into his actual Body and Blood. He commanded the Apostles to continue to do this in his memory. The cornerstone of the Early Church will become the continual practice of doing this fulfilled Passover meal, and it will come to be known as "the Mass." From the last night of Jesus's life, the Church has continually, for over 2,000 years, celebrated this mystery of changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Even today, the Church teaches that the Eucharist is no symbol, but actually God himself. The Church developed a special time of prayer with the Eucharist. Taking a piece of consecrated host, the Eucharist is placed in the center of a display case, known as a monstrance, in order for the faithful to gaze at Jesus and to pray within his midst. This exposition, or praying before the Eucharist is called Adoration and is one of the most intimate and personal methods of prayer for many Christians.

WEDNESDAYS AT 7:00 PM

Every Wednesday, the parish community has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament available in the main church from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM. You are invited to come to this hour for as long or as little as you like. This will be a great opportunity during the week to spend some quiet time with the Lord. The hour will conclude with Evening Prayer from the Divine Office at 7:45 PM followed by Solemn Benediction at 8:00 PM. Bring your family and friends. Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is also offered during this time.

MONDAY MORNINGS

Join us on Monday mornings following daily Mass for a Holy Hour in the Adoration Chapel from 8:15 AM - 9:15 AM. Come start your week in quiet reverence and stillness with the Lord. All are welcome to attend.

Our Story

Our History

Holy Cross parish began as a mission of Our Lady of Solace, in 1943. The mission was founded by then pastor of the parish, Monsignor Edward P. Buttimer. A small house at 4112 East Genesee Street was purchased on October 30, 1942. It became home to the mission church and catechetical center. The first Mass was said on Pentecost Sunday, June 13, 1943.

In May 1944, the property between the house and St. Mary's Cemetery was purchased from Dr. G. Leslie and Miss H. Leslie with the intention of building a church on the site. Because of the scarcity of building materials during World War II, ground was not broken until September 11, 1949, and the church was dedicated on April 23, 1950.

In November of that year, Reverend Joseph I. Ritchie was named as the first pastor, which he held until his death on March 18, 1964.

As DeWitt and the surrounding area developed and grew over the years, so too did the community at Holy Cross. Due to the generosity of this community, Holy Cross saw the expansion and addition of land, buildings, and staff. Construction of a rectory was finished in March of 1951. A convent was added in 1957. And Holy Cross School opened its doors to students in September of 1958.

Our Church Home

Because of continued growth in the area, a new church building was needed to accommodate the people and activities of Holy

Cross. In 2002, then pastor of the parish, Msgr. J. Robert Yeazel and the Parish Council voted unanimously to build a new church. On September 14, 2006, that church was dedicated on the Feast of the Holy Cross.

Today, Holy Cross continues its tradition of being a caring community devoted

to the needs of our families, neighbors, and society. We value our faith and the food God gives us for the journey. We are committed to our families and youth, to providing a safe environment to form their faith. We build our lives in the image of Christ through worship and prayer. We serve and accompany our neighbors in need and those on the margins. We share our faith with others to spread the Gospel. To be faithful stewards of Holy Cross, we are accountable to God for responsibly sharing our time, talents and treasures. We work as a parish to establish and implement our goals and objectives, mindful of our diverse community and ever-changing needs.

We invite you to get connected with our Holy Cross family. There are many opportunities for all walks of life, and we hope you'll find or create an opportunity to connect with others in our community.


Community Events
