Spiritual Reflection for Sunday March 7, 2021

Exodus 20: 1-17 Ps: 19:8-11

I Corinthians 1: 22-25

John 2: 13-25

What do we demand out of our relationship with God? For what do we look? Saint Paul addresses these questions in his First Letter to The Corinthians. Paul says that Jews demand signs and the Greeks (Gentiles) seek wisdom, but for those who God calls, no matter they be Jew or Gentile, they see



Christ as the one who is the "power of God and the wisdom of God."

We must remember that the people to whom St. Paul writes are from divergent faith practices. They are used to demanding signs, or they may desire to relegate faith to something that can be proved, not just believed, but Paul insists that they have been given both signs and proof that Jesus the Christ is the one for whom they search. Paul also suggests those called by God are able to discern the presence of the true Messiah.

Paul goes on to say, "For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." For us who have been called are asked this Lenten season to put aside the doubt that demands a sign, and the doubt that cause us to demand God prove his love for us. The signs of God's love are among us, and especially in Lent, we can see the desire within ourselves to more closely unite ourselves to Christ. This desire in itself is the proof that we are created by a loving God who wants us to be close to him, not only in his time of suffering, but in his resurrection as well.





LAUDATO SI' CIRCLE

A LENTEN JOURNEY

HUNGER & WANT



Welcome to our third week of the Laudato Si' Circle Lenten Journey! Each week we will share a new theme that will encourage us to grow deeper in our love, knowledge, and concern for creation. Follow our mediation and reflection prompt, research and reading resources, and suggested action steps.

Meditation: This week our theme is hunger and want. Spend at least fifteen to twenty minutes reflecting on this. Use our readings and quotations as inspiration. We've provided some initial questions to help you explore this week's theme on a personal level, but feel free to follow your thoughts wherever they take you. It's not too late to start a journal to help you record and process those thoughts. If you're so inspired, start a conversation about your meditation with a family member or friend.

Research/Reading: Spend some time this week learning about food justice issues in our local community and around the world. We'll be looking at local organizations that support the welfare and dignity of each per-

son in our community that is hungry and in need.

- MOTHER TERESA

Action: Follow our steps that you can take individually or as a family that will help you grow deeper this Lent spiritually while having a positive impact on those in need.

MEDITATION:

Read Matthew 25:31-40 ... Truly I say to you, to the extent that you did it for one of the least of these brothers or sisters of Mine, you did it for Me.

Consider these quotations from Mother Theresa:

"At the end of life, we will not be judged by how many diplomas or how much money we have. We will be judged by, 'I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in.'"

"If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed just one."

"When a poor person dies of hunger it is not because God did not take care of him or her, it is because neither you nor I wanted to give that person what he or she needed."

Take a moment to reflect on these questions.

- How can I give food to the hungry?
- Do I personally know people who do not have enough to eat or go to bed hungry?
- Have I ever had to go without food or worried if I would have enough to eat?
- Do I take having food for granted?
- Do I waste food? How much do I throw away?

RESEARCH/READING:

- Hunger and food insecurity are global problems that affect people locally as well as millions of people around the world. Here are links to a couple short videos:

ACTION:

- During Lent, sponsor a crop at Matthew 25 by donating money to buy the seeds and, if possible, plant and maintain the crop & harvest when ready.
- 2 Get outside: Volunteer as a family at Brady Farm or Matthew 25 Farm. Go to their website or call them for more information and sign-up.
- 3 Help at a soup kitchen: Volunteer at the Samaritan Center or Emmaus Ministry.
- Question Rice Bowl: Use your CRS Rice Bowl and Lenten Calendar to guide your prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Visit crsricebowl.org to watch videos of the people you support through CRS. Donate to CRS through the Sec-

ond Collection next week.

Make a gesture of solidarity: do without something this Lent and donate the money to an organization that feeds the hungry families.
