Spiritual Reflection for Sunday, April 25, 2021

Acts: 4:8-12 Ps 118 1 John 3:1-2 John 10: 11-18

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." As we hear this message and realize that we are the sheep, we should feel humbled. We may forget that Jesus is out there watching over us. Sheep in the field go about their life, often paying little attention to the shepherd



until danger presents itself. They lead a carefree life because of the shepherd, who is always watching out for them. We are able to lead our lives as well because Christ is watching over us, but unlike the sheep in the field, we have a responsibility to communicate with our Shepherd. Jesus wants us to communicate with him, to pray, to ask, and to praise his works. Not only with our lips do we do this, but also by the way we live our lives.

Jesus has laid down his life for us! We see that every time we look intently at a Crucifix. We should be thankful that he has opened the gates of heaven for us and that salvation can be ours. Because of his care for all of his children, he is the good shepherd. As this Easter Season continues, let us praise God for all he does for us in this life, and for what he will do in the next.


