
Scriptural Reflection for Sunday, April 4, 2021 Easter Sunday

Acts of the Apostles 10: 34a, 37-43 Psalm 118: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23

Colossians 3: 1-4 John 20: 1-9

Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

On this most Holy Day let us put ourselves in the place of Mary of Magdala as she approaches the tomb. She is there to anoint the body of Jesus be-



cause they buried him without ceremonial washing due to the Sabbath. Mary is upset, devastated at the death of Jesus, and now wants to do this one last thing for him. She approaches the tomb to find that the tomb is open, the stone rolled back. Upon entering the tomb, she sees that the body of Jesus is gone and a man seated at the right side. Being amazed she hears the man say, "Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not her. Behold the place where they laid him."

Do we feel that same sense of amazement when we think of Christ rising from the dead? Have we walked with Christ during this Lenten Season, and participated in Holy Week? If we have, we must remember the blessings Christ gave to his followers before his death. Jesus instituted the Eucharist and Priesthood on Holy Thursday, he carried his cross on Good Friday, was crucified and now has resurrected from the dead on Easter Sunday. Are we moved by the love and compassion that has been demonstrated by God our Father through his Son Jesus? If we answer yes to that question, then, let our faith be ever the stronger so we can experience the great victory and joy the entire Easter Season has in store for us!


Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament 7:00 - 8:00pm on Wednesdays.
