Spiritual Reflection for Sunday, May 2, 2021

Acts: 9:26-312 1 John 3:18-24 John 15:1-8

How much are you willing to give to God?

Following Jesus asks much of us and it offers much in return, including the eternal love of the Father. In the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus say, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower." If we are truly to remain united to Jesus, we must unite ourselves to Christ in two ways. The first is that we must take on the mind of Christ and follow what the Church teaches, and the second is that we must live a moral life as taught by the Church. When we fail to do either of these, we are like leaves that begin to wilt. Although attached to the vine, they begin to loose life and vitality.

What in our life causes us to wilt, or move away from Jesus and his Church? When we explore what causes us to move away from Christ we often find that it is failure to love one's neighbor. Often the cause of this failure to love as we ought is self-centered behavior that leads us into sin. When we focus on ourselves, it is difficult to care for those around us. The fact that Jesus commands us to love one another and live a moral life should be enough cause for us to repent. When we do repent from our sin we will be able to see Christ in the other, and in doing so, Christ will strengthen us!


