Spiritual Reflection for Sunday May 30, 2021

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Deuteronomy 4: 32-34, 39-40

Romans 8: 14-17 Matthew 28: 16-20

As we celebrate The Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity, we see Christ address the disciples, as they continue to doubt in their ability to believe in everything Jesus has done and taught, as well as their own ability to carry out His mission in the world.

Jesus reminds them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in

the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." In this command, Jesus speaks of the Holy Trinity, and its importance in the life of the Church.

As we receive the Sacrament of Baptism, we know that Christ claims us for his own, and instills the gift of the Holy Spirit in us. It is in this first Sacrament that Christ claims us for our own, and God exposes us to the creative force of God the Father, the redemptive force of God the Son, and the sanctifying force of the Holy Spirit, which descended on the Apostles at Pentecost. With the gift of the Holy Trinity in our life, we, like the eleven disciples mentioned today in the Gospel of Matthew, go out into the world to bring others to know the goodness of God.



After careful review of the CDC guidelines and the adoption of the guidelines by NYS, Bishop Lucia is announcing changes to our COVID protocols for Mass attendance, sacramental life and diocesan/parish office operations. Here are some important details:

- All who prefer to continue wearing facial covering and social distancing are free to do so.
- Certain aisles in the church continue to have distanced seating for those that prefer or are not vaccinated.
- Hand sanitizer will continue to be available at all church entrances and in the sanctuary.
- Distribution of Holy Communion by clergy using hand sanitizer, masks, and physical distancing will continue.
- The dispensation from Sunday Mass will discontinue next weekend, June 6, 2021, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ


