<u>Scriptural Reflection</u> for Sunday May 31 - Solemnity of Pentecost

Acts 2: 1-11 Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34 I Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 John 20:19-23

The excitement of receiving a gift comes with a responsibility to use that gift effectively, for the good of all, not just for ourselves. We may not even want the gift or know what to do with it.

Today we hear a reading from Acts of the



Apostles as it recounts the coming of the Holy Spirit to them. The gift of the Holy Spirit results in them being able to speak in tongues! Amazing! However, they must have wondered why that gift would be useful to them. Perhaps they would not have wished that gift for themselves. We know that the purpose of this gift was to equip the Apostles to carry the Word of God to people of every nation and tongue as we see represented in today's reading as those who heard of this gathered and found that even though they spoke different languages, each herd them in his own tongue.

The disciples will find this gift both rewarding and challenging realizing that it would not be easy to carry the word of Christ to all people, that persecution would surely come, and with that persecution, glory!

We need to reflect on what gifts the Holy Spirit has given us. Do we understand the gift received? Have we prayed about the use of that gift and are we ready to go out and teach all nations in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirt?

A Note From our Pastor regarding email solicitations:



May 31, 2020

There have been reports from parishioners across our diocese who have received emails and texts from individuals claiming to be their pastor. Usually the content of the message will include some form of request for money that is outside of the normal channels of giv-

ing, for example electronic gift cards for amazon or iTunes. These messages usually include some sense of urgency and may span over several emails, beginning with an inquiry like "Hi are you available? I have a quick request." Some of these fraudulent attempts have gone so far as to create email accounts which look very much like an official address. Please be aware that neither our parish nor father will ever reach out to you directly via email text or social media for direct solicitation of gift cards, wire transfers or other electronic monetary transactions. If you suspect you may have received a fraudulent request, or would like to confirm the genuineness of a message, please contact our parish office. Support Brady Faith Center: Brady Farm CSA

Community Supported Agriculture, called a CSA, is a great way to get farm-fresh produce on a regular basis from a local farm, and Brady Faith's Urban Farm is a wonderful way to support healthy food & jobs for inner city families while feeding your own family. When I purchase a CSA, I am participating in Brady Faith's vision to create "an urban farm woven into the fabric of the community that provides sustained nutritious foods, employment, and education that nourishes the body, mind and spirit of the residents."

Jesse Lyons & Alice Gallagher have been the farm coordinators for several years. Their education & experience in the science of ecology & agriculture bring a depth of knowledge about healthy soil practices and organic farm management. Their passion for the farm and the local community is contagious. The farm offers free or affordable fresh food to south side residents with little access to fresh produce.

The summer CSA program begins on June 6; when you join, you can choose a CSA for an 11 week or a 21 week subscription at a cost of \$15-\$25 per week. Variations include an option to add produce from "regional farms" or a "grocer's box" of added items not locally grown. If you wish, an additional donation can be added to support a local family in need. A local pick up spot will be assigned. Samaritan Center Update:

Holy Cross volunteer groups scheduled to volunteer in April at the Samaritan Center were cancelled. Our next scheduled date for Holy Cross volunteers is in the fall: September 13th & October 25th. Our coordinators, Rick Coughlin & Kay Keough, are looking forward to our return & we have already scheduled our 2021 dates.

As of March 13th, Samaritan Center has modified its operations to a "take-out" model of service; scheduled meal times remain unchanged and meals are provided daily. Their goal is to continue to provide uninterrupted meal service while maintaining appropriate health and safety measures. During the pandemic, operations are limited to just a few regular volunteers & they are not accepting new volunteers. Although current times are very difficult for all of us, they are significantly more challenging for the vulnerable population served by the Samaritan Center.

If you are interested in helping with current needs, these items can be dropped off at the center, 215 N. State St., Monday- Friday 9 am- 12 pm:

Face masks, hand sanitizer, napkins, toilet paper, kleenex, pre-packaged cookies & snacks, plastic forks & spoons, fruit cups or fruit, individual juice, water or milk, or financial support -- thank you for your good thoughts & prayers!


