Scriptural Reflection for Corpus Christi

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a 1Corinthians 10: 16-17 John 6:51-58

Today we celebrate Corpus Christi, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In this celebration of the Eucharist, we acknowledge that God, through Christ, gives us the strength we need as we make our journey through this world to the Heavenly Kingdom!



We are told that life in this world is transitory, meaning it is ever changing us and preparing us for the world to come with God. Moses, in today's first reading reminds the people that God brought them out of the Land of Egypt, through the desert experience of forty years of suffering. In a similar way we see Jesus the Christ tell his followers that eternal life may be found through Him. This journey, just like the years in the desert for the people of the Old Testament, will not be easy, but if one journeys with Christ, they will receive the Bread of Life. This food for the journey is what we seek when we approach the altar of God each time we attend Mass.

Do we as Catholics recognize each time we receive the Body of Christ that Jesus is feeding us while we are in our own desert experience? The food that Christ gives us is food that can strengthen us for our journey through this life towards our eternal home with God the Father.



Inspiration for the week

They recognized him in the breaking of bread. This was the amazing revelation or epiphany that occurred on the Road to Emmaus. Bread that had been transformed into the Body of Christ opened the eyes of the disciples and showed them who was really with them. Their hearts were burning. Sometimes we struggle with our belief in the Eucharist because we make it too much of an intellectual challenge. If God's divinity was wed to humanity in the incarnation of Christ, then why is it not possible for God to take simple elements of bread and wine and transform them into his Body and Blood?
