Spiritual Reflection for Sunday June 20, 2021

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Job 38:1, 8-11 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 Mark 4: 35-41

In today's Gospel from Mark we hear the familiar story of the disciples, in the boat with Jesus, attempting to cross to the other side of the sea, when a severe storm arises. The



storm tosses the boat about and the disciples fear for their life. As they fight the storm, Jesus remains asleep.

The disciples wake Jesus and ask him "teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus quiets the storm and rebukes them for not having faith in God. God was protecting them and yet, even with Jesus at their feet, they fear. The interesting thing in this account is that the disciples still do not recognize that they should not have feared, but they instead are amazed and ask themselves "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?" They are amazed at the power of Jesus and wonder just who he is, but they still fail to see God in their midst.

We are like those disciples, at least at times in our life. How many times do we find ourselves gripped by fear and fail to recognize the power of God among us, keeping us safe. Ultimately, the disciples were afraid to die, just like we are often afraid to die, but ultimately it is our bodily death that leads us into the loving arms of God. We just must be patient and wait for God to call us home to be with him. While we remain in this life, let us not go about in fear!


We begin the hour in the church with Adoration Eu & will conclude with Solemn Benediction.

Covid Protocol Update

After careful review of the CDC guidelines and the adoption of the guidelines by NYS, Bishop Lucia has announced changes to our COVID protocols for Mass attendance, sacramental life and diocesan/parish office operations. Here are some important details:

- Parishioners who are **fully vaccinated** are not required to wear a face mask at Mass, but are welcome to wear a mask if preferred. We kindly ask that all others continue to wear face masks.

- Hand sanitizer will continue to be available at all church entrances and in the sanctuary.
- Distribution of Holy Communion by clergy using hand sanitizer, masks, and physical distancing will continue.
