Dear Holy Cross Friends,

Thank you so very much for the exceptional way you have helped us reach out to those who are in such need through the annual HOPE Appeal. Your support in 2018 was heart warming!

In the past year you have helped nearly 230,000 individuals in 121 parishes across the 7 counties that make up the Diocese of Syracuse! This help included life-saving food, especially for families and children. Over 95,000 individuals have received food assistance this year. Those who visit our hospitals receive the benefit of Catholic chaplains who offer support and comfort to the patient as well as families. Because of your generous support many of the 4467 young people in our diocese who long for a Catholic education are afforded that opportunity through tuition assistance. The diocese supports refugee families in our area. Each year many individuals who have come to our wonderful country have been assisted with resettlement services, language skills, and housing. Each year your HOPE Appeal donations support the education of our seminarians, the future servants of your church! These are some of the most visible ways that HOPE Appeal monies help those within our diocese, but I assure you there are even more who are helped each day. Together, we can be the hands of our Lord who brings comfort to those who are most vulnerable and need to experience God's love.

This year our parish HOPE Appeal goal is \$113,165. As you know, 50% of any overage above goal comes directly back to Holy Cross parish to support our work in evangelization, education, faith formation, and youth ministry in order to further the mission of our parish. I am asking each family to consider a pledge of \$325 (less than .90 cents per day ~ less than the cost of a bottle of water or Coffee!) The average priest gift was over \$700! This shows how much your priests believe in the work that Hope Appeal makes possible! Some people have asked if I can guarantee that Hope Appeal donations do not go to pay for the clergy scandal. I can guarantee that, and personally know that our contributions, including my personal contribution, goes to the programs that I have mentioned above in order to serve the people of our diocese

PLEASE – those of you, who are able, prayerfully consider increasing your pledge this year. Remember, this is our diocese and the ONLY annual campaign that serves our needy brothers and sisters in this manner.

PLEASE – If you have not been a part of the HOPE Appeal in the past, offer your support this year. This is our parishes' way of bringing Christ to those most in need. Please be part of our family effort!
