

Sunday, June 7, 2020 First Reading, Exodus 34:4-6,8-9 Psalm Daniel 3:52-56 Second Reading:2 Corinthians 13:11-13 Gospel, John 3:16-18

This weekend we celebrate a beautiful but also challenging Feast in the Church's liturgical calendar. The Most Holy Trinity reminds us of the importance of the unity of the Father, Son, and the Spirit as three persons of one substance. When I was in seminary, we had an icon in one of the chapels that depicted the trinity in a beautiful way. An artist named Andrei Rublev depicts three Angels that visited Abraham by the oak of Mamre (Genesis 18:1-8). The three angels are sitting around a table symbolizing harmony, peace, and spiritual unity. If you look closely, these Angels all point towards each other unifying themselves around what looks to be a chalice bowl with the Sacrificial Lamb. Taking what we understand the Sacrificial Lamb of the Old Testament and Christ as the Sacrificial Lamb in the New Testament, we can understand the sacrifice on the altar made in the Old and New Testament.

When we think of the trinity, we often are confused by making the Father, Son, and the Spirit three distinct persons. This is contrary of our Trinitarian belief. Each time we make the sign of the cross at the start of Mass or a prayer, we recall our Trinitarian belief. We focus on the God who makes himself known through Jesus and the Holy Spirit who is given to us through Christ after His Ascension into Heaven.



Our Gospel Reading focuses on God's love for each of us when John says in his Gospel "God so loved the world; He gave His Son so that all may have eternal life. With all the confusion around this feast, we must focus on the foundation of the trinity, this is to say that God's love for us is stronger and is given freely to us through God the Father Who created us the Son who redeems us, and the Spirit who Sanctifies us. Let us reflect on how God the Father, the Son, and the Spirit calls us and guides us in all that we do. May the Holy Trinity Bless us and sanctify us in all that we do. Amen! Fr Matt Rawson

Month of the Sacred Heart @ HOME

June 1 - June 30 Ordinary Time - Month of the Sacred Heart

Pope Leo XIII, through an encyclical letter in 1899, dedicated the whole Catholic world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Devotion to the Sacred Heart was also an essential component of Pope John Paul II's hopes for the "new evangelization" called for by the Church as he said, "For evangelization today," he said, "the Heart of Christ must be recognized as the heart of the Church: It is He who calls us to conversion, to reconciliation. It is He who leads pure hearts and those hungering for justice along the way of the Beatitudes. It is He who achieves the warm communion of the members of the one Body. It is He who enables us to adhere to the Good News and to accept the promise of eternal life. It is He who sends us out on mission. The heart-to-heart with Jesus broadens the human heart on a global scale."On June 1, 2008, at his weekly *Angelus* address, Pope Benedict XVI encouraged Catholics to "renew devotion to the Sacred Heart of Christ in the month of June."

Parental blessings: Parents can trace the Sign of the Cross with their thumb or forefinger on their child's forehead at any time while asking God to bless him or her.

Create a Prayer Corner: Simply place a small table in your dining room or living room, wherever best suits your needs. A beautiful icon or a crucifix can be hung on the wall above the table. A Bible, prayer books, holy water and basket of rosary beads can be placed on the table. Children's books on saints or with Bible stories can fill a basket or bookshelf nearby. You might want your prayer table to reflect the various seasons in the liturgical year, adorning it with flowers on holy days or Marian feast days

Laudato Si' Year: The worldwide Church recently marked the <u>fifth anniversary</u> of Pope Francis' promulgation of his encyclical "Laudato Si', on Care for Our Common Home." To commemorate the event, the Holy Father has called for a "Laudato Si' Year" which began on Sunday, May 24th and will continue through May 14, 2021. Bishop Lucia's May 20th editorial in the Catholic Sun encourages us to take this document seriously:

"Most importantly, Pope Francis reminds us that we are all connected. We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world, and to those who will come after us in future generations — a message that should resonate with all of us during this COVID-19 pandemic.

I admit that this particular papal writing, although criticized by some, is one that is especially close to my heart. It speaks of values I was raised with concerning care for neighbors and care for the environment. Growing up in northern New York in a small, rural town surrounded by God's creation put me very much in touch with the Earth and its preservation, along with the sharing of its produce. While weeding a garden and picking wild blueberries or wild strawberries weren't always things I wanted to do growing up, they have produced stories and lessons I will not forget.'

Men's Shelter Update:

Recently, Catholic Charities Men's Shelter staff were alerted that one of their guests tested positive for COVID-19. An emergency plan was enacted in which the shelter was closed for 11 hours to be deep cleaned and some individuals, both staff & guests, were quarantined in a separate location. A doctor & a nurse from Syracuse Community Health Center are now on site to monitor the temperature and symptoms of staff and guests.

Although guests can choose not to wear masks, Shelter staff wear masks, face shields & gloves. Volunteers delivering food to the shelter are not allowed to enter at this time; they are greeted outside by staff who take the donated food inside.

Working from home, a few Holy Cross volunteers prepared a hot meal and made sandwiches for the shelter recently. They miss the



A Note From our Pastor regarding email solicitations:



There have been reports from parishioners across our diocese who have received emails and texts from individuals claiming to be their pastor. Usually the content of the message will include some form of request for money that is outside of the normal channels of giving, for

example electronic gift cards for amazon or iTunes. These messages usually include some sense of urgency and may span over several emails, beginning with an inquiry like "Hi are you available? I have a quick request." Some of these fraudulent attempts have gone so far as to create email accounts which look very much like an official address. Please be aware that neither our parish nor father will ever reach out to you directly via email text or social media for direct solicitation of gift cards, wire transfers or other electronic monetary transactions. If you suspect you may have received a fraudulent request, or would like to confirm the genuineness of a message, please contact our parish office.
