## Sunday July 19, 2020

First Reading Wisdom 12:13, 16-19 Psalm 86 Second Reading Romans 8:26-27 Gospel: Matthew 13:24-43

We hear in our psalm response today "Lord you are good and forgiving." Psalm 86 shows the compassion and the mercy of God. When we look at any of the psalms, they allow us to focus our prayer and center it on what we need at any particular time. When we listen to the verses today, we hear a tone of praise to God for always being there when needed. We remember



that the Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years following after Moses who led them to the promised land. We can only imagine the struggles that they would have went through such as abandonment, frustrations, and anger toward God during that time. When we continue to read the psalm today, we hear the psalmist pray to God asking Him to turn His ear towards us and listen. Indeed, God does that when we ask Him, although it may not immediately seem as though He is listening, He listens and answers in His time. The psalmist acknowledges God's greatness and His wondrous deeds and implores God again to turn towards him and give him strength. When we read psalm 86, we can recall that God is always there for us, we simply need to pray to Him. The psalm reminds us that when things get difficult, we must turn and put our trust in God. How has your relationship been with God? Do you put your complete trust in Him? All of us at times have difficulties trusting in God and allowing Him to see us through our hardships. How can you put your complete trust in God today and allow Him to walk with you on your Journey?




## **Confessions Wednesday Evenings – Chapel**
