Scriptural Reflection for Sunday, July 26, 2020 **Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

I Kings 3:5, 7-12

Psalm 119: 57, 72, 76-77, 127-128, 129-130

Romans 8: 28-30 Matthew 13: 44-52

The First Book of Kings reminds us we should use discretion in what we ask of God. King Solomon, when visited by God in a dream asks for understanding so he might continue to serve the people God has entrusted to him. This



request may seem unselfish, and indeed, God recognizes that and praises Solomon for not requesting riches or other blessings for himself. We hear Solomon question his own ability to lead God's people, the wisdom he seeks will benefit all because of the right decisions Solomon will make.

I wonder if given the same opportunity by God to ask for whatever I want, would I make the wise choice. There are so many desires and apparently necessary trappings that we all want at times that it seems miraculous that Solomon would ask for such a selfless blessing.

What will we ask of God? Are we prepared to ask for the greater benefit of those whom we serve instead of our own benefit? Can we keep the needs of our parish, families and communities in mind? Today perhaps we can devote our prayer to praying for increased wisdom for ourselves. Imagine how much improved our lives can be if we make wise decisions based on the will of God, not our own will and desires.






Confessions Wednesday Evenings – Chapel


