# **Steubenville Youth Conference Reflection**

A few weeks ago I had the opportunity to take the young people of our parish to the Steubenville Conference in Steubenville, OH. This conference, hosted on campus at Franciscan University draws over 2,000 young people for a weekend of talks, worship, confession, all culminating with Adoration on Saturday evening. When I proposed to the youth a chance to attend this retreat, I was overwhelmed by the response. From Holy Cross, we brought 30 teens, and 15 young adults & adult chaperones. (including our very own Fr. Matt & seminarian Ben Schrantz). What a gift to see so many people respond! In fact, of the Diocesan trip of 145 people, we were the largest youth group, making up almost  $1/3^{rd}$  of the trip. I wish to take a moment, not only to point out the amazing things the Holy Spirit is beginning to do in our young people, but especially to give glory to God in the ways He's moving them. Since our trip, its been amazing to see a real group form, with a deeper identity in Him. I was amazed to hear that our teens this week have been video-calling each other every night and praying the rosary, as well as a weekly commitment to a daily Mass together that we began at the beginning of the summer. Thank you for your prayers. The Holy Spirit is real and is certainly at work in them!

Recently, I was particularly moved by a young teen that on her own initiative wanted to write a thank you card to the parish for their experience. I wish to share it with you all.

"Holy Cross Parish, I am very thankful to have had the opportunity to attend the Steubenville Youth Conference that took place at the Franciscan University of Steubenville in Ohio. During the conference, I met lots of new people and had a lot of fun, and most importantly, had incredible encounters with Christ. We got to go to adoration, confession, spiritual talks, mass and praise and worship while we were there. We grew closer to each other, and were constantly reminded of God's profound love for us, as this year's theme for the conference was "Belong". Thank you for your generosity, because I wouldn't have been able to have this amazing experience without you."

Thank you again for all your prayers for our youth! May God complete the good work He has done in these young people!

# **Novena Information**

What is a novena? A Novena is a prayer and meditation that is said for a specific intention for nine days. This prayer intention will be prayed with Catholics across our diocese and beyond for Bishop-Elect Lucia.

Why pray a novena? Novenas are an ancient tradition that goes back to the days of the Apostles. Jesus told His disciples to pray together after His ascension into heaven, so they went to an upper room along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, (Acts 1:14) and joined constantly in prayer for nine days. These nine days of constant prayer by the Apostles at the direction of Jesus led up to Pentecost. This is when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as "tongues of fire" (Acts 2:1-4). This pattern of 9 days of prayer is the basis the novenas we pray today. Thus, the novena is an imitation of the Lord's command to the Apostles when they prayed for 9 days in anticipation of the coming of the Holy Spirit.

**How do I pray a novena?** Begin by quieting your self. After a moment of silence, begin your prayer with the sign of the cross. Pray the words of the Novena with reverence & intention. Follow the prayer with the Lord's Prayer, a Hail Mary & a Glory Be.

### What happens if I miss a day?

If you a miss a day, you can do one of a few things... You can either: 1) skip the day you missed altogether, 2) say two of the daily prayers in one day to catch up, or 3) say the prayer of the day you missed and just be one day behind everybody else. It's up to you, and whatever you choose to do is okay. There are no "rules" and there are no "consequences." God is forgiving and merciful!
