


Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

<u>Spiritual Reflection for Sunday, August 15, 2021</u> <u>Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u>

Revelations 11:19, 12:16, 10 1 Corinthians 15: 20-27 Luke 1: 39-56

When we think about the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we can talk about her willingness to bear the child of God, we can focus on her strength as a woman in various stages of pregnancy who traveled first to "the hill country in haste" and then to Bethlehem for the birth of Jesus in the manger. These are important aspects of God's plan for the salvation of His people. But even more important can be the aspect of Mary's life in which she humbly took her place as the God-bearer- the



"Theotokos". This Greek word conveys the sense that Mary is the vehicle by which God became man. This is a lofty place in history, but Mary approaches it as a humble servant of the Lord. Her words in today's gospel bear this out.

As she sits with her cousin Elizabeth, who herself is miraculously pregnant with the baby who would become John the Baptist, Mary speaks about the way God has blessed her with a crucial role in His plan for our salvation; "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my savior." In a situation where she could rightly bask in the attention and admiration of her cousin, Mary points to the greatness of God as the most important part of her situation. "He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation, he has shown the strength of his arm and has scattered the proud in their conceit." She goes on to detail the goodness of God, and diverts all attention and honor to the one who truly deserves it.

As we approach the feast of the Assumption of Mary where she is brought bodily to heaven, let us seek to emulate the humility that Mary shows in her life and look at God and others as greater than we.



In fact, you may find the process of becoming a Catholic somewhat slower than you would like... because membership involves making a firm commitment to God and to the local Catholic community, and is not to be undertaken lightly!

There are two sides to becoming a Catholic--receiving instruction in the faith, and taking part in the services of a local Catholic community. You can start with one or the other, but you will need to have completed sufficient instruction AND be attending regular services before you can become a full member of the Catholic faith.
